Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000, relating to road crossings. Please see the response below:

*Whilst we hold information regarding the location of some assets within your request, the information we do hold is not held in the format that is being asked for. In order to locate and collate comprehensive information in relation to question 1 and 2 we would need to interrogate our existing asset registers and combine this with on-site audits of existing to verify the presence on site. None of the information we hold is currently broken down into types of pedestrian crossings as you have sought. KCC do hold records in relation to the location of your requests but in order to locate and collate these records to comply with your requests it would certainly exceed the appropriate limit of £450 (18 hours @ £25 per hour), so under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act, we are not obliged to deal with this element of your request.*

If you are unhappy with this response, and believe KCC has not complied with legislation, you have 40 working days from the date of this response to ask for a review.
