*I am writing to request the percentage of students who received over 70% on average (and or distinction classifications) in the MPhil Real Estate Finance program throughout the years 2013-2017.*

For years 2013-14 to 2016-17 there are no students recorded with outcomes 'pass with distinction' or 'pass with merit'. For years 2015-16 and 2016-17, no overall grade result for this MPhil is recorded.
