I have done some costing. The site needs to be cleared of turf. The overall size is 4metres by 15 metres. Topsoil to a depth of 100 mm needs to be excavated and a few drainage pipes laid. 2 bags (0.6 cu. m) of scalpings need to bought, laid, rakes and impacted. 1 bag pea shingle and 1 bag fine grit. That's 4 bags at £39.50 each; reach one raked and impacted. There would be no charge for delivery and they'd bring an impactor with them as well as 16 scaffold planks for the edging, each costing £14.

I assume the lorry would deliver to the bandstand site and taken from there to the pitch. The hire of the impactor would be about £45 per day. A few drainage pipes would not be expensive and so the whole thing would cost less than £500 assuming that the excavation and tools would be supplied by Park Estates. I cannot be at the meeting but please indicate that my commitment is long term and I would be able to supervise the construction if needed, provide the game equipment, and teach the game.







I sent out e-mails to 600 people. 40 people responded by e-mail (which is apparently a very good response rate) of whom only two were against, both on the grounds that it used up part of a small park to the detriment of other users. Overwhelmingly the response was very positive. Some people expressed concerns about maintenance, I responded saying that the Friends would make sure it was maintained. There were concerns about balls going astray, but I pointed out that there would be a lip around the pitch, and some people felt there might be too many people. I repied to that sort of worry by saying that Camden H&S would be looking into those aspects. People wanted to be assured it would be free and open access. I was able to reassure them on those points.

In addition I think we can assume all the FoWP committee are for the project, as we have put it forward and there has been no objection at any committee meetings. That is another 9 people none of whom responded to the mail out! As well as that there another 5-10 people who didn't respond but when I bumped into them and asked, agreed it was a good idea and had no objection.

How are you getting on with Camden officials? We have had such support for the idea, I hope that, if they have problems, we can think it through to make it work.



Plus, as you yourself saw, if you randomly ask people in the park, they are very enthusiastic.

Just to follow up on the liability of petanque being played in a public park. Please see the response below:

'I share your views but would also consider the setting to be important. If, say, a decision was made to install this within a play area (given the increased risk of children running and being hit by a ball) then the risk of injury would be higher and may cause more difficulty in trying to defend any claims brought by users of the play area if injury occurs.

By way of a further brief note, should a member of public get injured, I suspect Camden's arguments in response would include:

- 1. Occupiers Liability Act 1957:
 - a. "...take such care as in all the circumstances of the case is <u>reasonable</u> to see that the visitor will be reasonably safe in using the premises..."
 - b. The test of 'double-reasonableness' is applicable to almost all PL incidents. Whilst cases turn on their individual facts, matters such as having the pitch in a suitable area, notices of the pitch etc. will all be taken into consideration if a claim is intimated.
- 2. Bolton and Others v Stone [1951] would apply:
 - a. Claimant injured when standing on a highway outside her house. Ball hit out of the cricket ground during a match. The ground was fenced.
 - b. It is not enough that there is a remote possibility that injury may occur: the question is would a reasonable man anticipate it?
 - c. Favourably to Camden in these circumstances, and was a claim to be intimated following a member of public sustaining injury, one can compare the aim in cricket to hit the ball as far as possible in contradiction to that in boules, to throw the ball at a specified target.
- 3. S.1 Compensation Act [2006]:
 - a. A court considering a claim in negligence or breach of statutory duty may, in determining whether the defendant should have taken particular steps to meet a standard of care (whether by taking precautions against a risk or otherwise), have regard to whether a requirement to take those steps might—
 - (a) prevent a desirable activity from being undertaken at all, to a particular extent or in a particular way, or
 - (b) discourage persons from undertaking functions in connection with a desirable activity.

There are many decisions where the Judges have relied upon s.1 Compensation Act [2006] in finding for the Defendant as to find for the Claimant in those circumstances might prevent a desirable activity from being undertaken.'

Many thanks for all your work on exploring the possibilities for this initiative. This will be very helpful in the decision making process which we will need to follow. As you will be aware, there is limited flat space in the park and that near the tennis courts is regularly used by young people for football and cricket etc. as they have no where else.

As Waterlow Park is a 'Trust' park any proposals for change need to go via the Friends of Waterlow Park Committee and the Waterlow Park Trustee Advisory Group (TAG). The latter, which I am Chair of, was set up by, and reports directly to, Camden Council (with Camden Council membership). I note that the Camden appointed rep. has already been copied in to the correspondence but is away on holiday at present.

TAG has its first AGM in October and usage of the park and facilities is something that will be on the agenda. Both TAG and FOWP have committee meetings set for early Sept. It would be good to have a separate, specific 'meeting' on this proposal at some point soon (probably will be September now) with representatives from the various parties concerned. At present, the new Trustee (Camden appointed) has not been named, and we will need to ensure he/she is also on board.

On a related note, do we know the liability situation should someone be accidentally hit by a ball?

Thank you also, for picking up on this point. As you know, I spoke with about this early on (when he came to the Park to look at signage) and I was showing him possible alternative sites after it became clear that a original location was not suitable.
Whilst the new site has much more space around and the slopes are different, the same health and safety issue obtain. Have we done a risk assessment? Having been hit by a petanque boule in France once I know that it is dangerous!
Looking at the map it would be extremely unlikely to hit anyone in the area above (as the petanque boule would have to be thrown very high in the air). However, on the south side of the court the situation is potentially more 'dangerous'. Also that footpath is used a lot especially by people pushing prams (as it is a nice, relatively flat bit!!).
Looking at the plan, there is a space between the end of the court and the beginning of the slope down to the footpath. This should mean that is is likely that the boule would hit the grass outside the court (before it got to the slope). and would just roll onto the footpath.
However, we would not want to discourage football and cricket players, nor to discourage people to walk along that bottom path for concerns about being hit by a boule. Likewise, we want to ensure that all is safe, so that, should the highly unlikely happen, we are 'covered'.
Do we have any assessment that will 'cover us'?

It seemed a good fit as the Petanque court was a community driven, community facility for the park. This is a fairly unusual situation for Waterlow Park, as there is less development in the surrounding area of the park within Camden – than say our more central wards where there is lots of development going on whereby developers have to contribute to green open space provision and or enhancement.







I'm afraid I can't find our original specifications, it was all so long ago, but this is the sort of thing:https://petanque.files.wordpress.com/2012/08/designing and building a petanque terrain v2.pdf The point about top dressing is that it should be just deep enough to provide the boule with some grip on landing, but not so deep that the boule sinks into it to any extent. When the top surface is too deep it is impossible to play the game properly. The ideal top dressing depth is about 6mm. So proceed with a fine layer of 4mm Crushed Carboniferous Limestone [Specification: BS EN 13242] and again remembering to keep this layer below 2½ x 3 or 4 MM in depth. Again, it is good technique at this stage to "rough cast" this layer across the area to produce variations in the depth of the material. A Maximum therefore of 2½ x 4mm = 10mm deep and say a Minimum depth of 6mm. Again vibrate this layer down fairly firmly – possibly watering as you do so dependent on how damp the material is. It needs to bind together as the compaction process proceeds. The compacted depth should finish up at between 3mm & 6mm and there should be all sorts of the desirable undulations in the surface. The coverage rate is approx 2.1 Tonnes Per Cubic Metre. Prices will vary across the UK, but can generally be about £15>£19/tonne delivered to site. Again, before you commit yourselves to the purchase of this material, have a sample delivered or go and view the source, to ensure an even distribution of grit to the dust in the mixture. It should be about 60% grit to 40% dust. If the pitch were properly finished, it wouldn't need much maintenance.

The trouble is that, if they topped it up, they topped it up with the wrong grade of material. The correct grade, as advised by the English Petanque Association, is finer so the balls can roll. It would be interesting to know when they topped it up as it was closed through most of Covid Lockdown.

I shall talk to FoWP about funding a top up with the correct grade (have you any idea of the cost?) but if the contractors or idverde have not fulfilled the contract, they should do it. If they have installed the pitch to spec, it should not need much maintenance. FoWP have already offered to do what's necessary but our volunteers won't want to put in the time and effort into a substandard pitch.

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
Apologies for the delay in coming back to you. I had to wait for the return of the colleague who oversaw the top up back in March. We carried out a top up to the surface layer with the aggregate that was applied originally. This is the same methodology for all our terrains which need an aggregate layer for the balls to land.

In terms of ongoing maintenance, it is crucial that rolling and wetting is completed to keep and after a discussion with I believe this is yet to pass over to his duties. However cyclical maintenance often doesn't meet the needs of the terrain in use and reliant on users contributing to the process. At Hurst Park in Elmbridge, the users complete raking and rolling to tie in with usage so as the consistency of the playing surface is maintained.

I'm keen to ensure this is right for you and happy to arrange for a further top up/roll of the surface, but onward maintenance needs to be arranged with so as he can resource it accordingly.

I'm afraid, previously I have followed up the specification of the court with the contractors who undertook the work, they returned earlier this year (February), and we are satisfied they have now honoured this.

When we first discussed the petanque court I was under the impression that a group of volunteers might like to help look after the court. We could consider purchasing a roller and or rake if volunteers would like to do this, it's not covered by our general park's horticulture contract and is unique for our parks across Camden.

If there really is a call for some more specialised surface we could consider this, especially if volunteers could help lay it. However, we would like to be reassured that there was consensus amongst players as to what this specification would be and why it was needed. There is a general feeling that court is quite under-used. I think the project should be raised via the friends at the Trust Advisory Group, which - copied in (chair of friends can arrange). I was at the Friends of Waterlow Park's AGM last night and supported another member in asking for a final surface to be added to the petanque pitch to make it fully playable. I was given your contact details by a committee member.
In the Friends' 'Summary of 2021-2022' it says 'Idverde has made good the Petanque pitch so people will be able to have a smoother game this year'.
As it is, the surface is too soft and grainy, which means balls can't roll, only stay where they fall. This takes out 2 crucial aspects of the game - judging the roll your own ball might make and nudging an opponent's ball out of the way. What we're left with on the current pitch is basically a surface for practicing shooting.
Waterlow Park's pitch could relatively easily be made fully playable with the addition of a couple of layers of sandy soil with a sprinkling of pebbles, and a really good, heavy-duty roll to impact the ground. We currently play at Caledonian Park and Parliament Hill (by the tennis courts). These 2 surfaces are different but very enjoyable to play on.
This pitch is in a great position and could be used so much more by the growing number of local people interested in the game.
I'd be so grateful if you'd look into this for us, please.
