Many thanks for getting back to me so quickly. I appreciate that you are probably very busy at the moment.

I am afraid I am unable to advise you as to who built the projects in question – presumably you mean here in Enfield.

Rather, we need to know the construction method that was used at the PPP schools in Edinburgh so that we can act accordingly; if necessary, of course.

It looks from the photo on the BBC website of Oxgangs Primary that it was a steel frame construction with blockwork infill for inner skin, rigid PIR insulation and a brick outer skin. From the condition of the insulation (largely intact), it looks like a possible failure between the inner and outer skin – possibly a wall ties failure, due to suitability and/or number of wall ties installed between the brick cladding and inner blockwork construction or some other type of failure.

Would you be able to advise us of the type of construction used please so that we can act accordingly here in Enfield, if necessary.
