



Big City Conversation - how should decision making work in the 21st Century?

Guest Speaker Briefing

You have been kind enough to agree to be a speaking guest at the above event. As the independent facilitator for the event I wanted to confirm the details and the format for the event and offer a short briefing on the approach to your comments.

The option to change from a Strong Leader & Cabinet system to a Modern Committee system will be put to the people of Sheffield at a referendum in May 2020 and Terry and the Scrutiny Committee have to define the principles of that proposed change by January's Council Meeting. That is an incredibly short and difficult timescale in which to try and get the public involved and to capture their thoughts and suggestions about what needs to be done. This is where the following event comes in, as a first step.

The event will consider the question;

How Should Decision Making Work? - and will look at the principles that ought to be part of designing any new decision making process to be developed before the Governance referendum in May 2020.

It will be held on Wednesday 30th October in Sheffield Town Hall from 6pm to 8pm.

It is part of the recently announced 'Big City Conversation' and this first event will collect evidence for the Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee that is carrying out a Governance Review for the Council, as decided at the July Council Meeting.

The format of the event is as follows; (subject to minor timing changes)

- Opening Comments 6pm (5 minutes)
 "How Should Decision Making Work?" What the meeting hopes to achieve
- **2 Informed Inputs** 6.05 to 6.30



- 3 Audience Comments & Questions 6.30 to 7.15 minimum (45+ minutes)
- **4 Breakout Session** 7.15 to 7.40 (25 minutes) and collection of evidence (suggestions questionnaires)

- 5 Terry Fox Process of Change 7.40 7.50 (10 minutes) political will capacity resources timescales
- Setting Priorities 7.50 to 8pm (10 minutes)

 Closing remarks and a final exercise in voting on the priorities for this review

In respect of your individual remarks I would simply say that the aim of this event is to get the audience thinking and talking about the change from Strong Leader to Committee model for making decisions. I want to draw out the audience hopes and thoughts on what should be the key issues in designing any new model.

I'm not asking guests to support or endorse either model of governance but to air some of your concerns and help guide the audience as to key issues to think about. I am looking for a short comment on the aspects of Council decision making and administration systems that have the greatest impact or are, in your view, most important for the city. You may even wish to explain your own key issues, drawn from your experience and understanding, to get the room talking, that would be great.

I hope that helps and I am happy to have a brief conversation before the meeting starts if that would help.
