## Freedom of Information Request – Planning letters/emails re HRE bridges

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed our search for the information, which you requested on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2021.

Your Request - Please send me all the letters and emails you have sent to and received from planning authorities about these Historic Railways Estate bridges. **Our response** - I am writing to advise you that we do hold the information relevant to your request, but regret to inform you of my decision not to disclose this information.

The information you requested is being withheld in reliance on the exception in <u>Regulation 12(4)(b)</u> of the <u>Environmental Information Regulations 2004</u> because the request is manifestly unreasonable.

In applying these exceptions, we have had to balance the public interest in withholding the information against the public interest in disclosure. The key public interest factors for and against disclosure are set out in the table below.





## Factors supporting disclosure

There is a clear public interest in the work of government being closely examined to encourage the discharging of public functions in the most efficient and effective way.

There is an important public interest in the work of public bodies being transparent and open to scrutiny to increase diligence and to protect the public purse.

There is a presumption in favour of disclosure within the legislation.

## Factors supporting non-disclosure

**Reg. 12(4)(b)**: the request is manifestly unreasonable on the grounds that it is vexatious.

This request, as with similar previous and current requests, is an exercise in fishing for information that forms part of a concerted campaign to disrupt the work of Highways England. As such, it is an abuse of the right of access to information.

Complying with this request would therefore place an unjustifiable burden on Highways England, and would represent a considerable diversion away from the mainstream delivery activities of the project.

There is no discernible purpose or value to the request, other than to disrupt Highways England's work and cause irritation, and there is no obvious overriding public interest in releasing the documents requested.

If you are unhappy with the way we have handled your request you may ask for an internal review within 2 months of the date of this response for Freedom of Information requests and within 40 days for Environmental Information Regulations requests. Our internal review process is available at:
