A list of all building formerly occupied by Hampshire Police that have been disposed of since 2010. 2b. The date of which they were disposed. 2c. For how much there were sold (if applicable). 3a. What estate assets are proposed for future disposal. 3b. The date by which disposal is proposed. 3c. Are these assets currently being	Hampshire Constabulary does not hold this information in a retrievable format. The cost of determining if the information is held, locating and retrieving the information exceeds the 'appropriate level' as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004. It is estimated that it would cost more than £450 to comply with your request. In order to ascertain the requested information, all the relevant details regarding the teams that occupied the building as well as the information relating to any sales and/or leases of police buildings, at any point during the period in question would require a large manual review. All property portfolios for the time period in question would need
