I write in response to the above-referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests submitted on 10/04/2017 and 18/04/2017. Thames Valley Police has now considered your requests, which for clarity, have been repeated below and aggregated under **Section 12(4)** of the FOIA:

<p>Please provide details of how many injury pension assessments have been made by Dr William Cheng since his appointment with TVP</p> <p>Please provide a breakdown of how many injury pensions were awarded by Dr William Cheng in each Banding from one to four prior to any appeal.</p> <p>Please provide details of the number of injury pensions either awarded or not awarded that where appealed with their initial banding and final banding</p> <p>****</p> <p>Regarding my FOI request could you ONLY consider all electronic communications via e mail as in the given time span as TVP have the ability iam assured to make this search automatically via their computer system.</p> <p>ORIGINAL REQUEST: Please supply</p>	<p>This request is being refused under Section 12(4) of the FOIA.</p> <p>Section 12 of the FOIA allows that public authorities do not have to comply with section 1(1) of the Act if the cost of complying would exceed the appropriate limit. In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act, this letter represents a Refusal Notice for this request.</p> <p>Some of this information is not held in an easily retrievable format, as there are over 400 medical pensions on our records, which would require a manual review. This will alone exceed the appropriate 18 hour time and £450 cost limit. These requests are on the same subject. Once one element of a request or requests, on the same subject, is considered to be excess costs, the entire request can be refused under this exemption.</p>
