"I would like to ask how many services which are provided by Dorset County Hospital have been contracted out to the Private Sector since 1st May 2010.

Please can the answer state

- (i) what the service is (eg pathology).
- (ii) the value of the contract of each individual service per annum.
- (iii) when the current contract is due to expire.
- (iv)What services are currently being considered for tender.

Please could this include all services which have points of contact with the hospital such as transportation of patients and not just those services which occur within the Hospital's premises?"
