Thank you for your email of 21st April 2017 in which you requested the following information:

I witnessed a visually impaired person fall between the gap of the 12.14 TPE train at Oxenholme today 21.04.17. Her dog then fell onto the track. She was caught by a member of staff but both passenger and dog were very distressed.

I would like to know what the risk assessment says about managing this risk and how many similar incidents have occurred. I have personally witnessed two people fall into this gap; the aforementioned and one other able-bodied person.

I have processed your request under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA). We have searched our records but we do not hold the information you requested.

This is, to explain a little further, largely down to the structure of the railway industry and our role within it. Whilst we are responsible for the repair, maintenance and improvement of the railway infrastructure, we only own and manage 18 of the approximately 2,500 stations across the network and Oxenholme is not one of them.

Whilst we do not hold the information in question we think you might be able to find it by contacting either the Department for Transport (which let the franchise to Virgin, the company which manages Oxenholme station) or the Office of Rail and Road (which regulates safety for both Virgin and TransPennine Express, the company which runs the trains through Oxenholme).

Both of the Department for Transport and the Office of Rail and Road are public authorities subject to the FOIA and requests can be made to them at the addresses below:
