**Freedom of Information Act 2000
Information in Relation to Consultations with Professor Iwaniec-Curl**

I am writing to confirm that the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (the Trust) has now completed its search for information relating to the above which you requested on 6 June 2018.

A response to each of the questions raised has been provided by the Children's Services and Social Work Directorate and is attached in Appendix A.

It is important to note that if you refer any matter to the Information Commissioner, you will need to show evidence of having gone through the Trust's internal review procedure to try to resolve the matter with the Trust in the first instance.

I wish to know how many times since April 2013 Emeritus Professor Dorota Iwaniec-Curl has been 'used/consulted' by the Trust in Family Proceedings?

How many times she has been jointly instructed with:

- a. The Guardian ad litem***
- b. The Mother***
- c. The Father***

Do the Trust always follow the Emeritus Professor's findings?

How many times have the Trust decided against the Professors conclusions?

How many times has the Emeritus Professor disagreed with Trust Care Plans?

The information you requested is not centrally held. To obtain this information would require a manual review of records.

This would exceed the 'Appropriate Limit' as defined by the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust therefore exempts the release of this information under Section 12(1).

12.-(1) Section 1(1) does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the authority estimates that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.
