In addition to District Nurses employed by the Health Board, please describe:

1. Are phlebotomy services provided by phlebotomists employed by the Health Board? Yes. The table below shows the number of Phlebotomists employed by the Health Board, by headcount and whole time equivalent (WTE).

In addition, Health and Social Care Partnerships (HSCPs) employ some community phlebotomists directly in treatment rooms and this is being expanded as part of the new GP contract arrangements.

2. Are phlebotomy services provided directly by GP practices by phlebotomists employed by them and, if so, how are GPs remunerated for this?

Practices make their own arrangements for phlebotomy – this may be done for example by Health Care Support Workers or Practice Nurses employed within the practice. GP practices are funded for the provision of General Medical Services based on a national formula – there is no separately identified remuneration for a specific service or role such as phlebotomy.

3. How are blood samples transported from the point of collection to the laboratory for processing?

Blood samples are transported by the hospital transport and portering service.

4. Do any phlebotomy services provided by your Health Board post blood samples to the laboratory for processing?

Please see our response to (3) above.
