# General description of the waiver required and the context of the request. Include which contract procedure rule to be waived.

It is sought Contract Procedure Rule 9.3 be waived.

The Council is currently out of contract for webcasting of Council meetings due to structural changes within the team in which this sits and the need to review provision in this area. The situation has been further impacted by uncertainties around the future use of the Guildhall for Council meetings and the fact that, during its renovation later this year, it will become unavailable for Council meetings.

As a result, a waiver is requested to continue to use the existing supplier for relevant Council and Executive meetings until at least the end of May and possibly for the Council meeting in July 2017. This will cover the emergency period until the procurement process for the full service finishes.

**Procurement Team Comments** 

The current contract has expired, however service is required. There is a delay in being able to finalise the specification due to uncertainty in the new requirement. Therefore, in the interim 4-month period this waiver seeks to establish a new contract on the same terms and price points as the previous contract. This is not ideal, but in the interim does seem to be the best option and therefore for this relatively small amount I support this waiver.

## **Legal Team Comments**

As specified above, CYC's CPRs require competition in accordance with 9.3 here.

Although not ideal, given the apparent urgent requirement here and brief duration proposed (so as to allow CYC to finalise the longer term procurement requirements) CPR waiver ground 28.2.7 could potentially apply ("...Involving such urgency that it is not possible to comply with the CPRs").

The value here would make this a below threshold matter for the purposes of Public Contracts Regulations 2015 and as such not subject to the full above threshold competition requirements. Although a challenge could not be ruled out as would be no competition here the risk on this front appears relatively low.
