### **Freedom of Information request – RFI20182115**

Thank you for your request to the BBC of 15 November 2018, seeking the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'):

*“Please explain where you got money from to start a BBC enterprise? The BBC as far as I’m aware is a public funded corporation that taxes the public to transmit propoganda. If I need to submit another FOI I will be contacting my MSP.”*

Under section 14(2) of the Act, we are not required to respond to repeat requests. The Information Commissioner’s guidance with respect to repeat requests states that where a public authority has previously complied with a request for information, it is not obliged to comply with a subsequent identical or substantially similar request from that person. This request is a repeat of your FOI request RFI20181336.
