Thanks very much for sending the paper and tables through. As discussed on the phone, I think it is very informative and clear.

Rounding rules:

To ensure that no individual can be identified we use conventions for the rounding and suppression of very small numbers. All numbers have been rounded to the nearest 100 if they exceed 1,000 and to the nearest 10 otherwise. Percentages have been rounded to 1 decimal place.

As discussed, there is no need to round the number of LAs (i.e. we can still say 58 LAs for example).
