From 28 October to 9 December 2015, we consulted on a proposal to change cycle provision around the junction of Maida Vale, Blomfield Road, Edgware Road and Aberdeen Place.


We received 83 responses to the consultation, of which 61 per cent stated they supported or partially supported these proposals. Having

considered the responses, we plan to go ahead with the proposals and aim to make the changes in late spring 2016.
