Dear Dean

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request which was received within the Trust. In accordance with S.1 (1) (a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), I can confirm that we do hold information relevant to your request.

1. How have you implemented these guidelines specifically it is important that women are offered, from the outset, the choice of having the procedure performed as a day case procedure under general or regional anaesthetic?

All patients who need a hysteroscopy are put through the outpatient hysteroscopy pathway and then onto a day case list if required. However, we absolutely do offer the choice at the point of referral to outpatient hysteroscopy, to have it done as a day case procedure under general anaesthesia. No patient is forced to go down the outpatient hysteroscopy route, if they would rather have it under general anaesthetic.
