Description:

The fence which has replaced the kissing gate blocks a very long-standing and well-used right of way. In 15 minutes I have just watched over a dozen people using the path. The diversion is much less pleasant as it is away from the river, it uses a water meadow which floods, and it runs dangerously near the ditch, into which it will be easy to slip when the grass is wet. Apparently the reason is to stockproof the boundary. This is nonsense: a kissing gate does that perfectly adequately (has a cow ever negotiated one?).

Thank you for contacting me about Fen Ditton Public Footpath Number 2. I have attached a map showing the legal line of the Public Footpath for your information. Please note that this a drawing taken from the Definitive Map, which is held within Asset and Information at Cambridgeshire County Council. You will see that the lega line of the Public Footpath is on the southern side of the hedge.
Landowners' have the right to stock proof their land and to maintain any barriers installed, e.g. kissing gate. As the kissing gate was directing the public along the river side of the hedge it was required to be changed so that the public could walk along the legal line of the footpath through the water meadow. The change has been made by the landowner and not Cambridgeshire County Council.
Provisional work was undertaken by our contractor to raise the ground level, on the legal line of the Public Footpath, next to the hedge. The work is shown in your image attached to your original message. A small section of fencing and gates at either end should stop cattle damaging the area. However, as the field is part of the water meadow it is expected that at certain times of the year the Public Footpath is likely to become waterlogged or impassable.
We, (Cambridgeshire County Council as Highway Authority), have a duty to keep open and maintain Public Rights of Way that are recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement. As the route used on the river side of th hedge is not recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement we are not obliged to undertake any maintenance.
It is possible for the public to claim that Public Rights exist and add these to the Definitive Map. There is more information on how make such a claim on Cambridgeshire County Council's website at http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/info/20012/arts_green_spaces_and_activities/199/definitive_map_and_state ment and by scrolling down to the section 'Making changes to the Definitive Map'.
Please note that it is also possible for a landowner to protect their land from claims that Public Rights exist by depositing a Section 31(6) 'deposit' with the Highways Authority. Information about 'Landowner Deposits' can be found at

I understand that records indicate that the landowner made such a deposit effective from 8th April 1999 and any potential claims would have to be made with evidence from those with twenty years or more use prior to this date.

3. Impact on wildlife. There is a lot of wildlife in the meadow behind the new hedge, for example water voles are active there, and the amount of walkers and joggers who use the meadows will disturb the wildlife.

I am aware that the 'official' footpath does run behind the hedge, but the route on the river side has been in use for several decades and I don't see why the gate has been changed now. The reason given by Bidwells to the resident of the cottage next to the gate was that the previous kissing gate was originally put on the wrong way round (over 30 years ago!) and they are keen to keep cows off the meadow adjoining the river for the Dragon Boat, Bumps and Rowing Regatta events. I am not sure why this also includes re-routing walkers.

I am very keen to establish the reasons for making this change and to find out what involvement the County Council has had in discussions with Bidwells and Natural England.

Thank you for your prompt reply and the information and details on how to claim a Public Right of Way.

The new raised ground / bridge is very welcome, but there is another gateway where the footpath will become impassable for several months of the year due to mud and flooding. The unofficial (but well used) path on the river side does not become too water logged (with the exception of the gateway) because the ground is higher I suspect this will be reported during the Autumn and Winter months by footpath users. The path has already become flooded with the recent storm.

I will contact Bidwells and see what information I can get from them. I am frustrated that the County Council and public purse should have to pay for this type of maintenance, rather than the landowner.

While writing, it is also worth noting that the County Council will be seeking the College's cooperation in the construction of the proposed cycle and footbridge to link Fen Road with Ditton Meadows, to the east of the railway bridge. This will involve the loss of land, both for the bridge and for the additional length of cycle path that is proposed.			
The expectation is apparently that there will be approximately 3,000 - 5,000 users of the route per day. If the County Council is unwilling to fulfil its responsibilities in relation to the existing rights of way network, then the College cannot be expected to have a great deal of faith in the future maintenance of an even more heavily used route (within the same land parcel). If that is the case, the College is much less likely to voluntarily provide the land for the scheme.			
I look forward to hearing the findings of your further investigations. As you have highlighted this as a public safety issue, I would be grateful for a prompt response (it now being over three months since I brought the matter to your attention).

Thank you for your time last Friday at Fen Ditton. I thought the meeting was very constructive and am now hopeful that we can now move forward to resolve some of the issues relating to that right of way.

You kindly agreed to investigate the possibility of engaging a contractor to construct additional steps at either end of the timber footbridge as well as the construction of an additional bridge on the very wet patch at the Fen Ditton end of the path.

In the meantime, I will seek quotations for the erection of further signage, the possible installation of a culvert at the same damp patch referred to above (and the making up of the ground in that area) and the reconfiguration of gates where the path enters Ditton Meadows from Fen Ditton.

You have helpfully reiterated your previous offer to supply road planings to consolidate the ground in some of the muddy areas and also offered to supply finger posts for the College to erect to mark the position of the legal right of way. We may take you up on this offer once we know how we are to proceed.

I look forward to discussing this with you further in a few weeks when we established what is possible.

Our contractor has slightly raise the ground level, on the legal line of the Public Footpath, next to the hedge. However, as the field is part of the water meadow it is expected that at certain times of the year the Public Footpath is likely to become waterlogged or impassable.

We, (Cambridgeshire County Council as Highway Authority), have a duty to maintain Public Rights of Way that are recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement. As the route used on the river side of the hedge is not recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement we are not obliged to undertake any maintenance.

Starting from Fen Ditton, by the kissing gate, the FP sign is somewhat ambiguous as it points straight along the hedge. As access to the actual RoW is obstructed by a wooden fence (part of the kissing gate) everyone turns into the field by the river. At present, with so much surface water, this is the only logical route, as there i a slightly raised embankment which keeps you out of the water. There is a sign by the gate which informs everyone that the footpath RoW is clearly marked - which it obviously isn't!

The first opening through the hedge which you can, in theory, take to rejoin the definitive line of the FP, is now deep in water; this is also true of the next breach in the hedge line. I will send photos of both openings.

I will also send photos of the regularly used gap in the hedge which leads into the next big field alongside the river (and where the unofficial path meets up again with the true line of the RoW). There is a photo as well of the unofficial hole(s) in the hedge and the messed up ground. Finally, on this section, I walked to the corner of the hedge where the definitive FP goes, only to find a large expanse of water which you would need waders to get through. So - even if there was access to the FP alongside the kissing gate you would be unable at presen to use it because of significant flooding further along.



the Definitive Map, which is held within Asset and Information at Cambridgeshire County Council. You will see that the legal line of the Public Footpath is on the southern side of the hedge.

Landowners' have the right to stock proof their land and to maintain any barriers installed, e.g. kissing gate. As the kissing gate was directing the public along the river side of the hedge and it has changed so that the public can walk along the legal line of the footpath through the water meadow. The change to the kissing gat has been made by the landowner.

Our contractor has slightly raise the ground level, on the legal line of the Public Footpath, next to the hedge. This has a small section of fencing and gates at either end should stop cattle damaging the area. However, as the field is part of the water meadow it is expected that at certain times of the year the Public Footpath is likely to become waterlogged or impassable.

We, (Cambridgeshire County Council as Highway Authority), have a duty to maintain Public Rights of Way tha are recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement. As the route used on the river side of the hedge is not recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement we are not obliged to undertake any maintenance.

It is possible for the public to claim that Public Rights exist and add these to the Definitive Map. There is more information on how make such a claim on Cambridgeshire County Council's website at http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/info/20012/arts_green_spaces_and_activities/199/definitive_map_and_state ment and by scrolling down to the section 'Making changes to the Definitive Map'.

Please note that it is also possible for a landowner to protect their land from claims that Public Rights exist by depositing a Section 31(6) 'deposit' with the Highways Authority. Information about 'Landowner Deposits' can be found at

http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/info/20012/arts_green_spaces_and_activities/200/landowner_deposits. We understand that records indicate that the landowner made such a deposit effective from 8th April 1999 and any potential claims would have to be made with evidence from those with twenty years or more use prior to this date.

We hope that the information above is of assistance.

Should you be inclined to begin to make a claim for Public Rights on the river side of the boundary hedge we will pass on your report to our colleagues in Asset Information Definitive Map.
