With each victim of fraud losing on average £4,000, this can result in loss of business confidence, working time, revenue and the cost of investigations and prosecutions

Young people most defrauded jobseekers in Britain

Get Safe Online, Safer-Jobs and Action Fraud are warning young people to take precautions whilst looking for jobs online, to avoid falling victim to scammers.

Figures from the City of London Police's National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) - say that the most defrauded job-seekers were between the ages of 18 and 25, and those aged 23 are the most likely to fall victim to scams when job hunting online.

Further examination of the figures shows that, on average, victims lose approximately £4,000 when they are scammed. Although scams that look to fraudulently secure £100 were the most successful, one victim reported losing £195,000. Over half (56%) of all defrauded job-seekers are based in London and 71% of job fraud scammers are suspected to be in London. Those next most at risk are living in Greater Manchester and the West Midlands.

The Recruitment Industry

- The rise of job scams:
 - impacts consumer confidence
 - affects the reputation of the industry
 - leads to financial losses through fraud
- Job Scams impact job seekers and recruiters
- The recruitment trade associations (REC, APSCo, TEAM) can and will support





What difference do SAFERjobs make?

- Provide free advice to all job seekers and employers
- Professional misconduct by agencies is reported to trade associations (if a member)
- Potential breaches of legislation is reported to government (BIS)
- Criminality is reported to law enforcement
- Fraud information is reported back to industry

SAFERjobs Success to Date

- Appeared on BBC News and BBC Fake Britain
- 2014 saw an increase in fraud reports as a result of website visits
- Partnerships with the Citizens Advice Bureau,
 Action Fraud, and Get Safe Online
- The Metropolitan Police have reached out to the Top 10 job boards with further action planned this year





2015 Fraud

- Most reports are 'after the fraud'...however......
- In January 2015 SAFERjobs prevented job seekers being scammed out of £11.5k
- The four scams were:
 - £7.5k for visa and insurance services for a Non UK National to work in financial services
 - £3.5k for work-finding services as an executive assistant
 - £500 for a security clearance to work in a warehouse, and
 - £50 for a criminal record check to work in a factory
- Advance Fee Fraud remains most common type

- A job seeker becomes a job seeker even if they are not even looking.....






E-Recruitment
