

Thanks for prompting me – as you say it's got a bit busy in recent days. I'm sending a partial answer now so you get a rapid response to your prompt, and then I'll be able to dig out the documents etc that you've asked for (at least any that I hold) later.
We have initiated the process you describe and have written to the variation is "operable and efficient". We currently await his reply.
With regard to the plant at Williamsgate – I have no documentation on this nor any information on the capital cost as it is not something that is funded by the County Council. The matter of what technical facilities are in place at Williamsgate is one for United Utilities to decide on; I would assume that rather than getting permission to build it they sought assurance that the capital cost would be met by Public Health England (as it was – now the DHSC Office for Health Improvement and Disparities) before they went ahead.
I hope that's helpful and I will endeavour to provide you with the letters in the coming day or two.

Thank you for your confirmation that the water fluoridation scheme from Williamsgate water treatment works is a "VARIATION" of an existing scheme and not a "NEW SCHEME" and that you, as the Director of Public Health are the responsible person and the appointed point of contact for the local authority Cumbria County Council (CCC) in this matter.
We should be grateful if you would provide the information requested and answers to the following questions.
Our understanding is that under current legislation (Water Industry Act 1991) and The Water Fluoridation(proposals and consultation)(England) regulations 2013 that the statutory process for seeking approval of the "variation" is for the local authority to submit a proposal to the Secretary of State (SoS) for Health and Social Care showing the scheme to be operable and efficient. If the SoS agrees, permission is granted to proceed to the next stage of consultation. Based on the results of the public consultation, and following a request from the local authority, the SoS could then give the go-ahead for the scheme.
Will you please advise:
If CCC intend to follow this process? If not why not?
If the process has already started, how far CCC have progressed in this process?
