Dear Jo

Vincent forwarded me your email. Many thanks for getting in touch.

We really appreciate your efforts in coordinating the police response. It would be really helpful if this was available within the next four weeks, if possible. At this stage in the review process we do not necessarily need a comprehensive response. What would assist us is confirmation that the current Firearms Acts cause the police significant problems and perhaps some specific instances of these problems. Any information you have collated, however, would be greatly appreciated. Once we publish our Consultation Paper in July it

would be very useful if there could be a response to that – perhaps giving a view on whether we have identified the correct problems and on the suitability of our solutions. As I said, this publishes in July and responses must be submitted by October / November.

On a different matter, Vincent and I will be in Birmingham on Friday 15 May to visit the Proof House. If it is convenient, would it be possible to call into NABIS too? You mentioned when we met that it would be helpful for us to have a chat with Martin Parker and this might be a good opportunity for us to do that.
