## SUMMARY OF BEST PRACTICE:

- Volunteers must follow the instructions of the staff member.
- Care taken when accessing the site, proper distance kept from livestock with an escape route should the volunteer feel at risk
- Avoid touching the livestock, hands must be washed nearest opportunity after contact. Avoid hand touching to mouth and eyes.
- Wear appropriate PPE for tasks, groups are advised beforehand to wear long sleeve tops and trousers to minimise risk of ticks and Lyme's disease and from stinging nettles. Walking boots in good condition is advised.
- Mobile phone to be carried along with contact details with staff.
- Notify a contact to be aware of the activity you are doing
