# **Request for Information**

A request for information was received from the Applicant by email dated 22nd January 2019 in terms of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 ("the Act"). The Applicant requested the following information:

"Dear North Ayrshire Council

Could you please provide me with the following information in respect of each primary school in your area; for every year from (and including) 2010 to (and including) such future year as information exists.

- 1) The school commencement date and if different, the appropriate latest date (both as defined in the Education Scotland Act 1980) on or before which a child must attain the age of five years in order to come within the category of children whom your local authority consider of sufficient age to commence attendance at that primary school on that school commencement date
- 2) A description of the decision-making process and factors taken into consideration by your local authority when deciding on the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date together with copies of any relevant guidance and policies used to inform or guide the decision.
- 3) Details of decision maker(s), who has been consulted including advisers in relation to the decision-making process on the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date together with information and copies of documents relevant to such consultations and copies of such advice.
- 4) Details of the timeframe for the decision-making process and dates when the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) fixed for each year.
- 5) The documents in which the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) officially recorded and fixed for the purposes of section 32 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980 and the documents or location where they were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) published or made known to the public.

6) Details of any changes made to any school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date under subsections 32(2)(b) or 32(5)(b) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980, the reasons for such change and details of any consultations carried out on changing the school commencement date (or dates) in respect of schedule 1, paragraph 6 of the Schools (Consultation) (Scotland) Act 2010 since its commencement on 5 April 2010.

The document attached to the response read as follows:-

"North Ayrshire Council does not set the guidance for registering children for education - the Scottish Government set the guidance for all schools in Scotland. The Council therefore gives notice under Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 that this information is not held. Summarised this means that in Scotland, almost all children between the ages of 4 and a half and 5 years old will start primary school at the start of the term in August each year. All children whose 5th birthday fall between 1 March on the year of enrolment and end of February the following year, should enrol in primary school.

# Request for Review

I appreciate your reply, however, you may have misunderstood the question. I am interested in understanding how the Local Authority set the actual commencement date in August each year for starting school. Therefore each of the questions relate to how this date is decided and the actual date that the child must start school.

# Right of Referral to the Scottish Information Commissioner and Appeal

I confirm that if the Applicant remains dissatisfied with the decision of the Council, he/she has the right to refer the matter by way of a formal complaint to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner, details of which are undernoted. Such a referral has to be made within a period of six months from the date of receipt of this review in terms Section 47(1) of the Act. Further, when a decision has been made by the Commissioner both the Applicant and the Council are entitled to appeal to the Court of Session, on a point of law only, against such a decision in terms of Section 56 of the Act.

Such an Appeal has to be made within 42 days of the date of the Commissioner's intimation of his decision.

### FOI Review Response

Could you please provide me with the following information in respect of each primary school in your area; for every year from (and including) 2010 to (and including) such future year as information exists.

1) The school commencement date and if different, the appropriate latest date (both as defined in the Education Scotland Act 1980) on or before which a child must attain the age of five years in order to come within the category of children whom your local authority consider of sufficient age to commence attendance at that primary school on that school commencement date.

School commencement dates for pupil since 2010 have been/will be as follows:

The latest date by which a child must attain the age of 5 years to commence school on the school commencement date is 28 February of the following year.

2) A description of the decision-making process and factors taken into consideration by your local authority when deciding on the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date together with copies of any relevant guidance and policies used to inform or guide the decision.

North Ayrshire Council liaises with both East and South Ayrshire Councils regarding school holiday calendars and the allocation of holidays, teaching days and in-service days. Draft proposals are then issued to schools for their consultation and final proposals are agreed within the LNCT (Local Negotiating Committee for Teachers). Example letter to schools attached.

3) Details of decision maker(s), who has been consulted including advisers in relation to the decision-making process on the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date together with information and copies of documents relevant to such consultations and copies of such advice.

The process for determining the school calendar is detailed in the response to Q2.

4) Details of the timeframe for the decision-making process and dates when the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) fixed for each year.

North Ayrshire Council aims to agree the school calendar more than 12 months in advance of the academic year. For example, the holiday calendar (including pupil return date) for 2020/21 was agreed at the March LNCT.

5) The documents in which the school commencement date and/or appropriate latest date were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) officially recorded and fixed for the purposes of section 32 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980 and the documents or location where they were (or in relation to future years will be or are expected to be) published or made known to the public.

Schools are asked to notify staff, parents, pupils and other interested parties of school term dates and details are also published on the North Ayrshire Council website.
