Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 – 20200309001

I refer to your request of 06/03/2020

Section 17, of the of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 provides that Scottish public authorities are not obliged to comply with a request for information if the authority does not hold the information.

The Council does not hold records of the information you have requested, therefore we refuse your request.

The society does not hold a lotteries licence with Dundee City Council, they would only need to hold a licence in the area they society is registered with.

Please can you share any information that the council holds regarding The Scottish Conservative Prize Draw Society? In particular, I'm interested in the lotteries it has held, including the dates and amounts raised under council licence.

Please can you also confirm whether Scottish Conservative Prize Draw Society is still licensed by the council?

### **Your Right to Appeal**

If you are unhappy with this reply you may require the Council to review its actions and decisions in relation to your request.

The requirement for review must:-

- be in writing or other permanent form (please address it to me);
- state your name and give an address for correspondence;
- specify the original request for information and the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction; and
- be made within 40 working days of the date of this response, although the Council may, if it considers it appropriate to do so, consider requirements for review after that time has passed.

Your requirement for review will be dealt with by the Chief Executive. He will reply to you in writing promptly and in any event within 20 working days. He may:-

- confirm my decision with or without modification;
- substitute a different decision for my decision;

and will give you his reasons for so doing. If you are unhappy with the Chief Executive's decision you may then appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner. You must submit your appeal to the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months of receiving the Chief Executive's decision.
