Freedom of information request

Thank you for your email of 14 September 2018 requesting MBChB (UCAS code A100) application statistics for the years of entry 2016, 2017, and 2018.

The Edinburgh Medical School is renowned for preparing its students to be world class doctors. The MBChB programme curriculum aims to ensure that our graduates are caring, competent, confident and reflective practitioners, and are able to function at the highest level in academic, hospital or community settings. You asked for numbers of Rest of UK (RUK) domiciled applicants offering each number of points from 34 to 40 out of 40 points for the selector's score in each year. These are presented below.

You asked for the lowest selector's score (not including applicants with special considerations or reduced offers due to contextual information) for which an applicant was given an offer. These are presented below.

You asked whether additional A*s or UKCAT points above the requirements for maximum number of points on the selector's score are used to decide between applicants and if the selector's score is the sole decider. Our MBChB Selector's Handbook is available at https://www.ed.ac.uk/medicine-vet-medicine/edinburgh-medical-school/medicine/applying/selection. This describes our selection process in full and gives the scoring rubrics for A Level applicants on p.15. We score an applicant's best 3 A Levels and

the maximum number of points available in the A Level component reflects 2 or more A* grades predicted or achieved.

You asked the number of applicants gaining each score, 1 - 6, on the personal statement and reference. These are presented below.
