CAMH'S Transformation and Impact on Children in Schools

- CAMH'S Transformation and Impact on Children in Schools
- Reducing waiting lists and triage
- Group interventions
- User groups
- Pilot roll out of mental health champions in local schools
- Autism Diagnostic Pathway
- Local resources to support children at home and at school with Autism or challenging behaviour



The Local Offer

- We are currently reviewing the contents and presentation of the Local Offer.
- We are reviewing the Website and creating a paper version.
- We also want to distribute the paper version and leaflets to GPs, libraries, hospitals, schools and Job Centre Plus'.
- There is a Parent Consultation Event on the Local Offer on the 17th of March 2016 held by Haringey Involve.



SEN Transport

- We are looking at improving our transport offer to children with SEND by:
 - Developing Haringey's Travel Policy to offer more flexible transport
 - Reducing travel times
 - Using a 'bus stop' approach or central points of pick up for older more mobile children
 - Focusing on commissioning Independent Travel training (ITT)
 - Give parents/ carers the freedom to use their personal budget for transport rather than Haringey's PTS Service.



Portage and Supporting Early Years

- We will be introducing Portage from May 2016 workers will have a small caseload of pre school children with complex needs. There will be four workers initially each with a caseload of 10 children
- There will be additional financial support that can be accessed by nurseries to support children with complex needs, wherever they are.
- The training offer to nurseries is being revised with services such as Inclusion officers, Speech and Language Therapy and Area Senco's



Review of Haslemere Road Centre and Respite/Support

- Haslemere Road has received an Requires Improvement judgement at the last Ofsted Visit
- We will be working with parents and children in order to see what their needs and desires would be for services.
- We are looking at options which currently include:
 - Keep the services in-house
 - Commission the service from a provider as block contract whilst using the centre
 - Rent the centre out to a provider which would continue service
 - Sell the building and spot purchase packages from other providers
 - Give parents the money to purchase their own services



Opening of the New School (The Grove)

- This is the all age school for children with Autism 4-19 years
- It is part of the heartlands community schools and will open initially on the Heartlands site, moving to new premises in the new year
- The school will take students with significant learning needs, as well as those who are more able on the Autistic Spectrum.
- The school is taking the usual number of year 7 intake this year, we are waiting for information on their capacity for other year groups
- We have a lack of capacity at ages 19+ for local resources in specialist education settings



Update on Conversions

- We have converted 110 statements into EHC's
- We need to update the conversion timetable on the local offer -the current timescales and age groups are not right
- The current year groups are year 5 and 6
- We are issuing a working document, contacting families to discuss and identify any gaps and assessments required, issuing a draft for consultation and then a final - process quite long
- We have a staff member working only on the students in Youth Offending to carry out their conversions



Building Local Capacity (table discussions)

- 10-15 minutes discussions at the tables on what skill set and resourcing is needed to deliver best outcomes for children and young people with SEND
 - Engaging with parents, empowering and up-skilling them in terms of supporting their children in the appropriate way.
 - Engaging with children and young people to get their views
 - Having open conversations and discussions with parents.
