Transitions

- Young People may be receiving statutory services from education and social care or education alone
- YP may be transitioning into another education setting, or require assessment from adult social care or health services on leaving education
- Thresholds may be different for adult social care/health support from children's services

Children's Social Care – Respite and Support

- Children and YP are eligible for respite and support services or support from health services when their needs cannot be met from within the services or other advice available within the 'local Offer'
- Thresholds as laid out in eligibility criteria:
- A Permanent disability that may be physical or about learning
- A substantial disability such that the child cannot communicate effectively without systems of support
- Highly challenging behaviour with severe learning difficulties
- The child cannot independent care for themselves e.g. toileting /washing at a time the child would normally be expected to be able to do this
- Have complex feeding issues, such that the child may need to be fed non orally e.g. through a gastrostomy tube
- The child might need support at night as they cannot turn themselves over at night without help
- The child may have difficulties with his/her breathing during the day or at night

Adult Service – Care Act 2014

- Duty to promote individual wellbeing
- Prevent need for care and support
- Done through:

Information/Advice and support

Direct Services

Direct Payments

- Achieved by:

Assessment of adult's needs for care and support

Assessment of carers needs for support

What is Well Being?

- Personal Dignity
- Physical and Mental Health and emotional well being
- Protection from abuse and neglect
- Control by the individual over day to day life
- Participation in work/training or education or recreation
- Domestic/family and personal relationships
- Suitable accommodation
- Contribution to society

How to meet needs

- Accommodation e.g. care home or other premises
- Care and support at home
- Counselling and/or other types of social work
- Goods and facilities
- Information, advice and advocacy – local offer

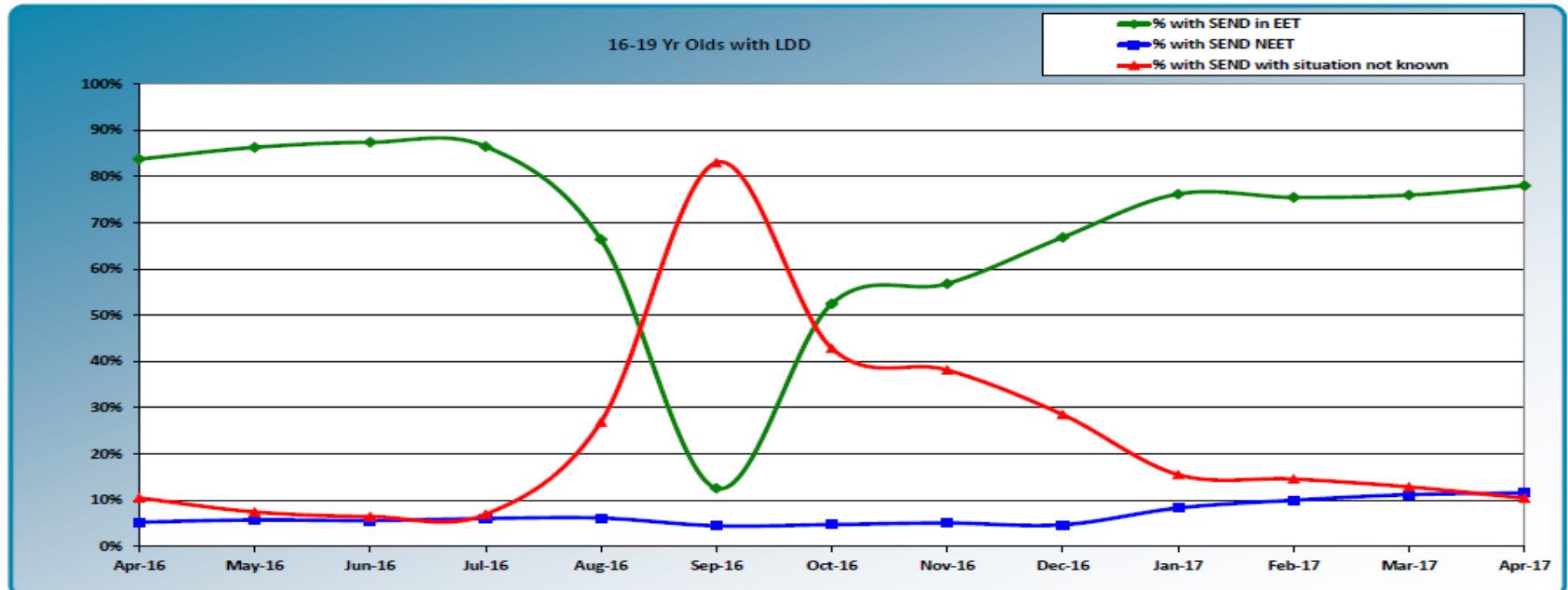

Destinations post Education

- We have referred this year 26 young people to Mencap:
 - 7 are in employment/traineeship
 - 1 is in full time education
 - 4 are job ready
 - 14 need support to be job ready
- We have 51 YP in apprenticeships across the borough.
- 75 Young People referred to adult learning Disabilities Team for assessment
- 7 Young people referred to adult mental health team for assessment

Requesting professional assessments/updated reports on time		
Professional assessments reports not received by LA on time		
Outcomes not being written in a SMART way by professionals		
Professionals involved with the child/YP not attending Conversion meetings/annual review meetings		
Families not being clear on accessing short breaks or personal budgets when going through the EHC process.		
OT/SALT not being assessed for, or included in the plan		
School Forms are too many and confusing
