2) Review of Respite and Support for Families with a budget from DCT

Reviewing current respite and support processes for those where a budget is provided because:

- ▶ We hope we will have a new provider for Haslemere Road overnight respite
- We do not have a wide range of short breaks providers
- We do not have a wide range of home care providers
- Families who have a direct payment say it is difficult to use, and we want to make it easier.
- ▶ We now have direct payments for more things e.g. transport/respite/education
- We are doing this alongside adult services as they have more practice with DP's
- ▶ We will have an event on the 10th May am at.....
- We want to find out more from families about what they want we would like to establish a small user group

3) Single Route of Redress - Tribunals

- ► From 4th April 2018 any education health and care plans issued after this time can be challenged by families in health and education section
- ► The tribunal can make a recommendation which may not be legally binding, but is open to further challenge if not followed (Ombudsman/JR etc)
- Attendees can apply to bring further witnesses if required
- Challenges may be around assessment from services, or provision from services if assessment has already taken place
- This applies to social care and health services in adult and children's services
