FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 - REQUEST 1523

Thank you for your request for information, which we received on 27 April 2015. You asked us for a breakdown of all the scriptures we currently have or had in the past 20 years relating to Sikhism or the Sikh religion.

We have considered your request, and our response is given below.

The British Library holds Sikh scriptures within the collections of Asian and African Collections. The Sikh scriptural holdings are largely historical in nature and stem from the Oriental language collections of the British Museum and India Office Libraries. Sikh scriptural holdings include both manuscript and printed items. No Sikh scriptural items are known to have been acquired in the past 20 years.

Information relating to these holdings (both manuscript and printed items) is publicly available and accessible through consultation of published catalogues held in the Library's Reading Rooms in London, and via other libraries which hold the Library's published catalogues. These catalogues are listed below and where they are available online links have been provided.
