Newall as the foundation to instigate the Student Lifecycle Project.

In the Response of another FOI request, Background information about the Student Lifecycle Project again by James Watson (<a href="http://www.whatdotheyknow.com/request/background">http://www.whatdotheyknow.com/request/background</a> information about the), it is stated that the Information Policy and Strategy Committee approved the £30,630.69 cost of the two reports.

I would like to know who the members of the IPSC were at the time of the approval of the aforesaid expense.

I would like to see a copy of each of the reports.

I would like to see the remit given to each consultant prior to them commencing their review.

In addition, for each report (i.e. separately), please supply:

- a) the submission date of the report.
- b) the date that the report was submitted to the SMG for review.
- c) the date that the report was submitted to the University Court for review."
