### **Freedom of Information Request - RFI20210477**

Thank you for your request to the BBC of 19 March 2021 seeking the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'):

*Please provide the text of any emails sent to BBC presenting staff who work out of Salford between 1st and 19th March 2021 inclusive which have any relevance to the issue of social media impartiality; who sent any such emails, and who were the recipients.*

We are withholding this information under section 40(2) (personal information) of the FOI Act. Under section 40(2), personal information about identifiable living individuals is exempt if disclosure to a third party would breach one or more principles in the General Data Protection Regulation. The individual(s) concerned would not expect their personal data to be disclosed to a third party. Therefore, disclosure would breach the principle to only process personal data lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner.

### **Appeal Rights**

If you are not satisfied that we have complied with the Act in responding to your request, you have the right to an internal review by a BBC senior manager or legal adviser. Please contact us at the address above, explaining what you would like us to review and including your reference number. A request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of receiving the BBC's response to your original request.
