I am formally responding, on behalf of Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU), to your request received by email on 21 October 2015, for a disclosure of information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You requested information relating to software development and training.

## Who is part of your software development and testing framework?

IT Services have not entered into an agreement with a third party to secure development and/or testing services. Only a very specific load testing has been undertaken by third parties. At present the majority of all development and testing is performed 'in-house' by LJMU permanent members of staff.

## What is your spend annually for development and testing of software?

Section 43 (2) of the FOIA makes provision for an organisation to issue a refusal notice when disclosure would place the organisation at a commercial disadvantage. The University believes that supplying annual spend for the development and testing of software would be likely to damage its commercial interests in any future negotiations and has, therefore, withheld this information from its response.

We do not participate in any framework agreement at a regional level.
