Thank you for your request for information relating to speeding reports.

Request

I'm advised by the local police that BCC are responsible for collating information on complaints about speeding and submitting proposed priority areas to WMP to enforcement operations.

Can you please

- a) Advise on how often you collate information from public complaints and pass the info/recommendations to WMP?
- b) Provide copies of the last couple of reports passed to WMP for action?
- c) Advise on what specific criteria are used for your prioritisation or recommendations (I notice the form on your web site asks not only about the level of dangerous drivers, but also about proximity to schools etc.) and how these are weighted to finalise the 'top x' sites recommended

Response

- a) All speeding concerns received from the public are recorded and collated. This information is passed to West Midlands Police on a case by case basis if it meets their threshold.
- b) Please table below for latest reports:

c) For every report submitted, the team reviews the most recent 3 years of collision data available from the STATS19* database. A formula is then applied to identify the roads with the highest number of road traffic

collisions, and prioritise those that resulted in a serious injury or fatality. Dependant on this prioritisation status, an appropriate course of action to be followed is identified. This could include the installation of a temporary Speed Indication Device (SID) is installed to gather speed data. If the speeds recorded meets The Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO) minimum threshold for determining whether there is a speeding problem on a road (if the 85% speed is more than 10% plus 2mph over the legal speed limit), this information is then passed on to West Midlands Police.

*This collects details on road traffic collisions resulting in personal injury reported to the Police.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within 40 working days from the date this authority issued its initial response to your original letter and should be addressed to:
