Date: 14th October 2016 Company visited: UKSAS Follow up actions Fleet vans service tyres and brakes. The events division has quad bikes, motorbikes and bicycles. There are also a number of land rover vehicles kitted for use in bad weather with winches. Gas storage is secure within the bay area.

Date: 14th October 2016 Company visited: UKSAS Follow up actions General Medicines Management: UKSAS Comments: have a robust medicines management system; they hold a Home Office CD licence. Drugs are ordered from Chelmsford pharmacy. At shift start crews pick up a drugs bag. The drugs bags are tagged green when complete and red tagged when any drugs have been used. They are stock checked when they are replenished. There is a locked cabinet in the bays for a limited number of drugs bags, all others are kept in the safe in a locked room. Morphine is issued from Colchester. Paramedics have their own hard back record book. There is an emergency 10 ampoules kept in the control room in a lock box inside a lock box. All paramedic staff are given safes for their cars and homes for transportation and storage of CD's.
