Request for Information - Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

In response to your Freedom of Information request, the Council's response to your request is as follows;

- Request; Full list of sweepers owned/leased by the council including make and model
- **Response**; 6 x Scarab Merlin 7.5t Sweepers and 3 x Bucher V50 12t sweepers
- **Request;** (If leased) Lease start & end date (month and year would suffice)
- **Response;** 2 x Scarab February 2013 end October 2022, 2 x Scarab March 2013 end October 2022, 2 x Scarab April 2013 end October 2022
- **Request;** (If owned) Year purchased & when the council are looking to renew their fleet of sweepers
- **Response**; 3 x Bucher 2022 renew in 5 years, all 6 x Scarab sweepers being returned at end of lease
- **Request;** Does the council carry out street cleansing duties in-house or is this contracted out?
- Response; In House
- **Request;** (If contracted out) who is the contractor responsible for street cleansing duties?
- Response: NA
- **Request;** Contact details for the person(s) responsible for managing the fleet and street cleansing within the council
- **Response**; Fleet Darren Smith, <u>Darren.smith@bury.gov.uk</u>, Street Cleansing Scott Burns, <u>S.Burns@bury.gov.uk</u>
- **Request;** Address of council depot responsible for managing the fleet and street cleansing within the council
- Response; Waste Management and Transport, Bury Council, Bradley Fold Trading Estate, Radcliffe Moor Road, Bradley Fold, Bolton, BL2 6RT

The supply of information in response to a Freedom of Information request does not confer an automatic right to re-use the information.
