FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: 0743-18

Thank you for your email of 11th July 2018 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

Please provide a list of student grant schemes like Chevening Scholarships, Great India Fund, and Great China Fund, known to the FCO and funded by taxpayers in the UK but provided to students outside the UK.

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

Please find below the information that the FCO can release to you. We can only release information we hold at the FCO. Other government departments including Department for Education (DFE) and Department for International Development (DFID) may also have information relevant to your request. You would need to submit a separate request to them individually regarding any information they may hold.

The FCO is responsible for two international scholarship programmes available to eligible students outside the UK. These are:

 The Marshall Aid Commemoration Commission, an Arm's Length Body of the FCO administers the Marshall Award offering postgraduate scholarships to study in the UK to US students. To find out more please visit: http://www.marshallscholarship.org

2. The Chevening Scholarship Award is an FCO programme and offers postgraduate scholarships to study in the UK to students in over 140 countries. To find out more please visit: http://www.chevening.org/.
