1 Introduction

Marriage, divorce and adoption statistics provides statistics on marriages solemnised, dissolved and annulled in England and Wales during 2006, as well as adoption orders in England and Wales during 2007. Summary statistics are also given in many tables for the 11 years 1996–2006, or other recent periods.

This volume updates the provisional data provided in the reports on divorces and marriages for 2006 that were published in *Population Trends* 129 and 132 respectively. The provisional data on adoptions for 2007 were published in November 2008.

This volume is produced by the Office for National Statistics (ONS). ONS was formed on 1 April 1996, bringing together the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys (OPCS) and the Central Statistical Office. OPCS is referred to in this volume for historic events and publications. On 1 April 2008, ONS became the executive office of the UK Statistics Authority, a non-ministerial department which reports directly to Parliament. The overall objective of the UK Statistics Authority is to promote and safeguard the quality of official statistics that serve the public good.

This volume is published under the National Statistics logo, the designation guaranteeing that those outputs have been produced to high professional standards set out in a code of practice, and have been produced free of political interference.

The registration of life events (births, deaths, marriages and civil partnerships) is a service carried out by the Local Registration Service in partnership with the General Register Office (GRO) in Southport. Since 1 April 2008, GRO has been part of the Identity and Passport Service.

1.1 Tables in this volume

Population

Tables 1.1 and **1.2** give estimates of the population of England and Wales analysed by legal marital status, sex and age.

Summary

A summary of marriages and divorces between 1996 and 2006 is shown in **Table 2.1**, with details of first marriages and remarriages, and, for divorces, whether either party had previously been divorced. **Table 2.2** gives marriage and divorce rates.

The remaining tables are divided into four major groups: Marriages, Divorces, New widowers and widows⁽⁵⁾ and Adoptions.

Marriages

Within the group of *marriage* tables there are analyses for a number of variables, arranged systematically, such as: period of occurrence (**Tables 3.1** to **3.6**), area of occurrence (**Tables 3.23** to **3.28**), type of ceremony and denomination (**Tables 3.29** to **3.35**), and whether the bride and bridegroom gave identical residential addresses before marriage (**Tables 3.38** to **3.41**). However, the same variable may appear in several other tables. For example, age at marriage is analysed in **Tables 3.15** to **3.20**, but also appears in **Tables 3.6** and **3.38**.

Buildings certified for use of worship and registered for the solemnisation of marriages are analysed in **Tables**3.42 and 3.43. **Table 3.42** shows the number of buildings certified as places of worship for different denominations. Churches and chapels of the Church of England and Church in Wales do not need to be certified, so are excluded from this table. **Table 3.43** shows the number of buildings of different denominations in which marriages may lawfully be solemnised. These tables are maintained by GRO.

Divorces

Divorces are also analysed in various sub-groups, such as age at divorce (**Tables 4.1** to **4.4**), age at marriage (**Tables 4.5** to **4.7**), duration of marriage (**Table 4.9**), details of children (**Tables 4.10** to **4.15** and **4.24**), and of the facts proven at divorce (**Tables 4.20** to **4.22**).

New widowers and widows

New widowers and widows are analysed by age of surviving spouse in **Table 5.1**, and in combination with age of the deceased partner in **Tables 5.2** and **5.3**.

Adoptions

Adoptions are analysed in **Tables 6.1** and **6.2** and are in two parts to show adoption orders by the date of the court order as well as the date the order was entered onto the register.

The listing overleaf sets out details of each marriage and divorce table in this volume.

1.2 Changes in this volume

Due to data quality issues, **Table 6.3** has not been updated for 2006 and 2007.

1.3 Data analysed in this volume

Marriages

Marriage statistics in this volume are based on details collected when a marriage is solemnised. The information is from the entry in the marriage register. The majority of the details are supplied by the bride and bridegroom to the person registering the marriage. This person may be a member of the clergy, an authorised person for a religious marriage, a secretary of a synagogue, a registering officer of the Society of Friends or a civil registrar. Examples of marriages entries used for civil and religious marriages are reproduced in **Appendix A**.

The data analysed in this volume are summarised below.

Supplied by the bride and bridegroom:

- *Marital status* (prior to marriage) is recorded as a *condition* in the marriage entry, and is used in a number of tables here, in particular **Tables 3.7** and **3.8**.
- Age at marriage (in years) is provided by both bride and bridegroom, and forms an essential part of many analyses here, in particular **Tables 3.15** to **3.20**.

Details of *usual residence* of bride and bridegroom at the time of marriage are recorded in the marriage entry, but are not recorded electronically. The information is not used for geographic analyses of marriages because the addresses given are not necessarily the same as the long-term addresses before marriage, or the same as the residence of the couple after marriage.

Details of *names* and of *occupation* of bride and bridegroom, of *father's name*, and of *father's occupation* are also recorded in the marriage entry, but not all are recorded electronically and therefore they are not tabulated in this volume.

Supplied by the person(s) solemnising and registering the marriage:

These details may be summarised as date of marriage, place of marriage, area of occurrence, the person(s) by, or before, whom the marriage was solemnised and registered, and preliminaries to marriage.

The place of marriage when the bride or groom is seriously ill and not expected to recover or is housebound could be the name of a hospital or hospice, or possibly a private address. With a detained person the exact venue is shown but this would be an alternative address that would not indicate a prison or psychiatric hospital. In the case of marriage in approved premises, the name of the venue is recorded, but not specifically that the premises have been approved.

The area of occurrence is the registration district in which the marriage was solemnised, although there may be rare exceptions. This may not be the district in which the couple reside, either before or after marriage. All geographic analyses of marriages are based on area of occurrence, not area of residence.

Derived by ONS from the marriage entry:

On receipt of the marriage entry at ONS Titchfield, further details derived from information supplied are coded and keyed.

- Legal preliminaries which authorise the marriage to proceed - derived from information supplied by the person registering the marriage - are classified as follows:
- banns
- common licence;
- special licence;
- superintendent registrar's certificate;
- Registrar General's licence.

See section **3.2** for more information. These details are used in **Table 3.34**.

- *Type of religious ceremony* derived from the place of marriage. This information is coded to one of 19 different denominations, analysed in **Tables 3.28** to **3.35**.
- *Civil marriages, location type* is classified in one of the following categories:
- in a register office;
- registrar registering a civil marriage in a building other than a register office or approved premises, but not in a registered building;
- in 'approved premises', derived from the identification on the marriage entry.

An indicator is also used to show whether or not the bride and bridegroom gave the same address at marriage (see **Tables 3.38** to **3.41**). Research¹ has shown that this is a reasonably good proxy variable for pre-marital cohabitation. Further information can be found in section **3** of this volume.

Divorces

Her Majesty's Court Service became an agency of the Department of Constitutional Affairs (DCA) in June 2003 when the DCA replaced the Lord Chancellor's Department. It has administrative responsibility for the Supreme Court, the Crown Court and the County Courts of England and Wales. In May 2007, the responsibilities of the DCA transferred to the newly created Ministry of Justice. The Ministry of Justice has responsibility for policy and legislation, but demographic information collected as part of that procedure is analysed and published by ONS.

Data tabulated in this volume are derived from the decree absolute form, supplied by the Courts to the Ministry of Justice.

While most information is supplied by the petitioner, some is also provided by the respondent to the Court. Information on the original marriage is usually derived from a copy of the marriage entry. A copy of the form used to record information required for a decree absolute (D105) is shown in **Appendix B**.

The data analysed in this volume are summarised below:

Supplied by petitioner and respondent:

- Date of marriage used in Tables 4.7, 4.18 and 4.19.
- Age at marriage (in years) used in **Tables 4.5** to **4.7**, **4.9**, **4.14**, **4.15**, and **4.17** to **4.19**.
- *Marital status at marriage* used in **Tables 4.16** to **4.19**.
- Date(s) of birth of any children aged under 18.
- Number of children aged 18 or over used in Tables
 4.10 to 4.15 (as part of the category of children aged 16 or over).

The length or duration of the marriage, used in **Table 4.9**, and the age at divorce (**Tables 4.1** to **4.4**), are derived from the date of marriage, age at marriage, and date of decree absolute. The age of child at petition is derived from date of birth of child and date of petition, and is used in **Tables 4.10** to **4.15**.

Supplied by the Court:

- Date petition filed and date of decree absolute both used in **Table 4.22**.
- Facts proven and class(es) of decree used in Tables
 4.20 to 4.22.

Summary information is supplied by Ministry of Justice for:

- Petitions for and decree nisi granted for divorce, nullity and judicial separation used in Tables 2.1 and 4.23.
- Orders under section 8 of the Children Act 1989 used in Table 4.24.
- Orders made concerning children in family proceedings
 used in Table 4.24.

The information on petitions provided by Ministry of Justice in Table 4.23 has been produced using the Management Information System (MIS), a data warehousing facility drawing directly from court-based information systems. The facility, implemented in June 2002, enables the Ministry of Justice access to more complete data than were previously possible including late submitted data for previous years. Figures for previous years were updated in 2003.

Further information can be found in section 4 of this volume.

New widowers and widows

Information about persons who become widow(er)s is available from the entry made at the registration of a death. The marital status of the deceased person and the age of the surviving spouse have been available since 1938 as part of the confidential particulars collected under the authority of the Population (Statistics) Act 1960. A copy of the draft entry form used for registering deaths is shown in **Appendix C**. This information is used in **Tables 5.1** to **5.3**, and more details are given in section **3.8**.

Adoptions

Information from adoption orders is derived from the Adopted Children Register. The Register is maintained by the General Register Office and contains the particulars of every adoption order made by a court in England and Wales and some overseas adoptions. The particulars included in an entry in the Register are shown in **Appendices D** and **E**. This information is provided by either the High Court, County Court, or Magistrates' Court.

The details used in this publication include:

- sex of adopted child (at birth);
- age of adopted child (at adoption);
- whether child was born within or outside marriage;
- date of court order;
- date of entry into Adopted Children Register.

Further information can be found in section 5 of this volume.

England and Wales: from 1974 to 1994 in the annual reference volume *Marriage and divorce statistics*, and from 1995 in *Marriage, divorce and adoption statistics* (both series FM2); for earlier years in the *Registrar General's Statistical Review of England and Wales*.

Historical statistics have also been published in the volume *Marriage and divorce statistics (Series FM2 No. 16)*. This covers the period 1837-1983 for marriages, dating from the year when the present national system of registration was first introduced in England and Wales. It also includes divorce statistics from 1858 - the first year during which a decree of divorce could be petitioned for and granted in a civil court within England and Wales - up to 1983.

Until 1973, adoption statistics appeared annually in the *Registrar General's Statistical Review* (part II). From 1974 to 1996 they were regularly published in OPCS Monitors (series FM3), and since 1996 they have been consolidated in this volume.

Up to 1998, annual data were first published in monitors, summarising marriages and divorces in England and Wales. However, these have now been discontinued, and replaced with news releases (i.e. press releases) and reports issued in the quarterly journal *Population Trends*. More up-to-date but less detailed statistics for the United Kingdom and its constituent countries are also published quarterly in *Population Trends* and *Health Statistics Quarterly*.

Other ONS sources include:

- *Birth statistics*² (series FM1) providing figures on live births and stillbirths. Analyses are provided by age of mother, marital status, whether the birth was within or outside marriage, and the duration of marriage.
- *Mortality statistics*: general (series DR) with analyses of deaths by marital status of the deceased.
- *Census* reports which include analyses by marital status, family composition, etc.
- General Household Survey news releases, annual reports and more recently web based tables - containing analyses on topics such as marriage, separation, divorce, remarriage, cohabitation; family statistics (including those on one-parent families).
- Labour Force Survey annual reports and articles in *Labour Market Trends*, with estimates of the number of families, married couples, etc.
- *Judicial and Court Statistics* (Ministry of Justice) which gives details of judicial aspects of divorce.

Statistics for the United Kingdom and Great Britain also appear in the *Annual Abstract of Statistics* and *Regional Trends*, while *Social Trends* includes occasional comment on particular aspects of trends in marriage, divorce, and remarriage. In addition, the *Focus On* series brings together relevant information on different groups of the population, with the editions on Families (2007), Gender (2008), and the 2001 edition on Men, of particular interest here.³

International publications of interest include Eurostat's *European Social Conditions - Population* (Luxembourg), the Council of Europe's *Recent Demographic Developments in Europe* (Strasbourg), the United Nation's *Demographic Yearbook* (New York), and *Population -* issued six times a year by INED (Institut National d'Etudes Demographiques, Paris).

2 Notes and definitions: general

2.1 Base populations

The population figures used to calculate rates in this volume are mid-year estimates of the resident population by marital status of England and Wales based on the 2001 Census of Population. These estimates include members of HM and non-UK armed forces stationed in England and Wales, but exclude those stationed outside. ONS mid-year population estimates are updated figures using the most recent Census, allowing for births, deaths, changed marital status, net migration and ageing of the population.

The estimates for 1996 to 2006, given in **Tables 1.1** and **1.2**, are based on legal marital status in England and Wales. They take into account births, deaths, changed marital status and migration. The single population are those who have never been married. Persons who are separated but not divorced are included in the married population.

In this volume, the population estimates were the most up-to-date when rates in this publication were calculated. The 2006 marital status estimates were published on 28th November 2007, alongside revised estimates for 2002 to 2005.

All these estimates incorporate the findings of the Local Authority Population Studies, the results of which were published in July 2004. Further information on population estimates, and their methodology, can be found at: www.statistics.gov.uk/popest

2.2 Coverage

The *marriages* analysed in this publication are those solemnised in England and Wales for each calendar year. Late notifications of marriage entries are not included in annual tables, but are retained on the ONS database. Marriage entries relating to marriages solemnised in 2006, but received by ONS after 22 January 2009 are not included in this volume.

Similarly, the *divorces* analysed are decrees of dissolutions and annulments of marriage granted in England and Wales in each calendar year. Late notifications of divorces are not included in annual tables, but are retained on the ONS database. Details of divorces granted during 2006 but received by ONS after 2 August 2007 are not included in this volume.

The number of *new widows and widowers* analysed in this volume are based on deaths of married persons occurring in 2006, that were registered and fully coded by ONS before 5 September 2007. Data received and coded after this time are not included in these tables, but are retained on the ONS database.

The tabulated *adoption* statistics are the number of applications for adoption, or orders granted and registered, in England and Wales in the calendar year 2007 that were extracted from the database on 16 December 2008.

2.3 Areal analyses

Marriages by area

Marriage entries are collated by registrars in the registration district where they occur. This means that area analysis is possible only by registration district or by aggregation of the data from these districts.

When local government areas are reorganised (such as over the period 1995 to 1998), the registration districts are also reorganised to the same boundaries as the areas they serve. In addition, local authorities can choose to amalgamate registration districts within their area. As a result, data for registration districts are not always comparable between years.

During 2006 registration districts were amalgamated in Durham, Gloucestershire and Worcestershire.

Divorces by area

Divorce data cannot be analysed by area of residence of the parties. Information is provided by the court granting the divorce. As courts are not evenly spread around England and Wales and couples may choose the court they wish to use, the location of the court is not necessarily a good indicator as to where the parties lived either before or after separation.

Details of the residence of the parties concerned are not available. This is because much of the information is collected at the petition to divorce stage of the process, and the parties' addresses may change before the decree absolute is granted; also the addresses given will not necessarily relate to the matrimonial home.

2.4 Rates

In this volume rates have been calculated using the most appropriate estimates of the population - see section 2.1. **Table A** on page **xxii** which sets out the denominators used.

2.5 Symbols and conventions

In this volume:

0 denotes less than 0.5

- denotes nil, and
- .. denotes not applicable

Rates calculated from fewer than 20 events (for example **Table 3.12**) are distinguished by *italic type* as a warning to users that their reliability as a measure may be affected by the small number of events.

Figures in some tables in this publication may not add up exactly due to rounding.

3 Notes and definitions: marriages

3.1 Terminology

Legally, a marriage is *solemnised* in either a civil or religious ceremony. Before the marriage, certain legal preliminaries must have taken place, the form of which varies. These are discussed in the section on legal preliminaries overleaf. The 'manner of solemnisation' will determine who it is that completes the entry in the marriage register and, although the same information is collected for all marriages, the precise questions asked may differ. Manner of solemnisation is analysed in **Tables 3.29 to 3.35.**

In this volume the terms 'single men' and 'single women' describe men and women who have never been married. From 5 December 2005 the terms 'bachelor' and 'spinster' are no longer used in marriage registers. After this date, the term 'single' replaced 'bachelor' and 'spinster', and is defined as someone who has not previously been married or formed a civil partnership.

3.2 Legislation and procedures

Legislation

The existing provisions for the preliminaries to, and registration of, marriages and civil partnerships and the processing, reporting and analysis of relevant data appear in different legislation that reflects the distinct and separate roles of the Registrar General for England and Wales and the UK Statistics Authority (the preferred name for the Statistics Board). The Registrar General is guided by the legislation set out below:-

The Marriage Acts

Marriage legislation is complex and is governed by the Ecclesiastical Licences Act 1533, the Marriage Act 1949 and the Marriage (Registrar General's Licence) Act 1970.

The major amendments to the Marriage Act 1949 that widened the places in which marriages may be solemnised are:

- The Marriage Act 1983 (with effect from 1 May 1984) enabled marriages of house-bound and detained persons to be solemnised at the place where they reside.
- The Marriage Act 1994 (with effect from 1 April 1995)
 made provision for civil marriages to be solemnised
 in any register office and in approved premises. Local
 authorities have responsibility for approving applications

for premises to be used for solemnising civil marriages, and for ensuring that the premises meet strict conditions. Premises which have been approved include hotels, stately homes and historic houses. There is also an increasing tendency for local authorities to make some accommodation in register offices available for civil marriage. The effect of the Act is discussed in detail in *Marriages in Approved Premises in England and Wales: the impact of the 1994 Marriage Act* ⁴.

Tables 3.4, 3.28, 3.29, 3.31 to **3.33** and **3.39** in this volume show marriages in approved premises.

Although the Marriage Act 1994 allowed civil marriages to be solemnised in any registration district, it did not affect the restrictions on religious marriages in registered buildings. They may only take place outside the registration district(s) of residence if the registered building is the usual place of worship of one or both parties or it is the nearest registered building to the registration district(s) of residence in which they can marry according to their desired rites and ceremonies.

The Immigration Acts

The Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, which came into effect on 1 January 2001, amended the Marriage Act 1949. It required that notice of marriage had to be given in person by each of the parties to the marriage, where formerly it had been possible for notice of marriage to be given by one person on behalf of both. It abolished marriage by superintendent registrar's certificate and licence and, with marriage by superintendent registrar's certificate, introduced a fifteen day waiting period (instead of twentyone days) before the marriage can take place. Finally, it amended the Marriage Act 1949 to give registration officers the power to require documentary evidence of name, age, marital status and nationality from the person giving notice. Additionally, Section 24 of the Act placed a statutory duty on registration officers to report to the Home Office any marriage they suspect is being contracted for the purpose of evading immigration control.

Under the Asylum and Immigration (Treatment of Claimants, Etc) Act 2004, from 1 February 2005, if either or both parties are subject to immigration control and they are marrying by superintendent registrar's certificates, they have to satisfy certain qualifying conditions and can only give their notices of marriage at a specially designated register office, which they must attend together. There are 76 designated register offices in England and Wales.

The UK Statistics Authority is guided by the following:-

Registration Service Act 1953: section 19 requires the UK Statistics Authority to produce annual abstracts of the number of live births, stillbirths, deaths, and marriages.

Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007: (the 2007

Act) transfers some of the statistical functions of the Registrar General, including the production of an annual abstract, to the UK Statistics Authority and the Office for National Statistics (ONS) becomes the executive office of the UK Statistics Authority. The 2007 Act also provides the Registrar General with a power to allow him to disclose any information entered in a marriage register or recorded about a civil partnership to the UK Statistics Authority for statistical purposes. It also enables the UK Statistics Authority to produce and publish statistics relating to any matter.

The coming into force of the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 and accompanying machinery of government changes on 1 April 2008 ended the arrangement whereby the National Statistician was concurrently the Registrar General for England and Wales. At the same time the General Register Office (GRO) ceased being part of the Office for National Statistics (ONS) and was moved to the Identity and Passport Service. The Statistics Board is the legal successor to ONS and inter alia undertakes the former statistical functions of the Registrar General. The responsibility for the production of marriage and civil partnership statistics is now a function of the UK Statistics Authority (the preferred name for the Statistics Board) which is required to produce an annual abstract of these statistics in order that the Minister for the Cabinet Office can lay it before Parliament.

Preliminary investigations

In satisfying themselves that the parties are free to marry, superintendent registrars may need to examine documents which support the parties' declared legal marital status: if a party states they are divorced, the registrar may wish to examine the decree which made the dissolution of the previous marriage absolute; if a party says their previous spouse has died, the registrar may want to see the death certificate or some other satisfactory evidence of death.

Persons under the age of 18 years who have not previously married must have the consent of each parent (if any) who has parental responsibility, or guardian (if any) or, if there is a custody, residence or care order in force, of the persons named in the order, before they may be married. In certain circumstances, the necessity of obtaining consent can be dispensed with by the courts, the Registrar General, or the superintendent registrar.

A marriage contracted in England and Wales between persons either of whom is under the age of 16 years is void. A person who has a lawful wife or husband living cannot contract a marriage. A marriage is void if it is contracted between

parties who are related to one another within a defined list of relationships - for instance, a brother may not marry his sister.

The types of preliminaries to marriage are shown in Table 3.34.

Preliminaries to marriage

In England and Wales a marriage may take place in a church of the Church of England or the Church in Wales after ecclesiastical preliminaries or after certain civil preliminaries. Any other marriage must be preceded by civil preliminaries. For a marriage according to the rites of the Church of England or Church in Wales, the alternatives are:

- (i) the publication of banns
- (ii) the issue of a common licence
- (iii) the issue of a special licence granted by, or on behalf of, the Archbishop of Canterbury
- (iv) the issue of a superintendent registrar's certificate

Banns must be published on three Sundays preceding the solemnisation of the marriage. A common licence obviates the need for publication of banns and enables couples to marry without delay; it is granted by the Church of England or Church in Wales authorities. A special licence is issued only in exceptional circumstances. It enables a marriage to be solemnised according to the rites of the Church of England or Church in Wales at any time and place, for example in an unlicensed chapel or hospital.

For marriage by superintendent registrar's certificates, both of the parties to the marriage must have lived in a registration district in England and Wales for at least seven days immediately before giving notice of intention to marry. Each party must give his or her own notice, in person, to the superintendent registrar of the registration district in which he or she resides. After giving notice of intention to marry there is a further 15 clear day waiting period before the marriage may take place. The marriage may take place up to one year from the date that notice was given. Under the provisions of the Marriage (Registrar General's Licence) Act 1970, where one of the parties is seriously ill, not expected to recover and cannot be moved to a place of marriage, the Registrar General can issue a licence for a marriage to take place anywhere without delay. Only one notice of marriage is given and the licence is valid for a month.

Procedures

There are two distinct procedures for marriage in England and Wales. Marriage may be solemnised according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England or the Church in Wales, and in all but a few cases this will be after ecclesiastical preliminaries. All other marriages must be preceded by civil preliminaries. All religious marriages with the exception of marriages solemnised according to the rites of the Society of Friends, those professing the Jewish religion, marriages of the housebound and detained

and marriages by Registrar General's licence, must be solemnised in buildings registered for the purpose.

Registration

In most cases the marriage is registered immediately after the ceremony. In churches and other buildings of the Church of England or the Church in Wales, it will be registered by a member of the clergy in duplicate registers. In registered buildings, the marriage is registered, either by a registrar in his own register, or by an 'Authorised Person' in duplicate registers supplied for the registered building. An authorised person is not necessarily the person who conducts the ceremony. In register offices and approved premises, the marriage is solemnised in the presence of a superintendent registrar and a registrar who carries out the registration. Jewish marriages are registered by the secretary (for marriages) of the man's synagogue. Marriages according to the rites and ceremonies of the Society of Friends are registered by the registering officer of the monthly meeting in which the marriage took place. In both these cases, marriages should be registered as soon as possible after the solemnisation.

Religious marriages other than those solemnised according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England, Church in Wales, Society of Friends or of the Jewish religion must usually take place in a building registered for marriages. Details of these buildings are given in **Table 3.43**. All buildings registered for marriage must also be certified as a place of worship. Details of these buildings are given in **Table 3.42**. For a building to be certified as a place of worship, the principal use of the building must be for religious worship.

3.3 Information collected

Examples of the entry as it appears in the marriage register are shown in **Appendix A**. A certified copy of each completed entry is received by the GRO in Southport for the compilation of central records and indexes, and is also sent to ONS Titchfield for the production and analysis of statistics. More details of the information collected are given in section **1.3**.

In recent years it has become increasingly popular for couples to choose to get married abroad. There is no legal requirement for those marriages of persons usually resident in England and Wales, but solemnised outside England and Wales, to be registered by the GRO. However, some overseas marriages are recorded with the overseas section at Southport. These fall into three main types: marriages of armed forces personnel, marriages that take place in certain UK consuls (only 15 out of 121 consuls have this facility), and marriages deposited under Article 7 of the Foreign Marriage order 1970. In 2006 there were 113 marriages registered with UK Consuls, 87 marriages registered by Forces Registering Officers and 1239 overseas marriages registered in the overseas section of the GRO. These 1439 marriages are excluded from the data in this volume. Note

that marriages deposited under Article 7 may not have taken place in the year they were deposited.

There are no representative statistics available for the total number of marriages of residents of England and Wales solemnised overseas.

Under the Forced Marriage (Civil Protection) Act 2007, where a forced marriage has or is about to take place, courts will be able to make orders to protect the victim or the potential victim and help remove them from that situation. ONS do not produce any statistics on forced marriages. For more information on the Forced Marriage (Civil Protection) Act 2007 please see www.opsi.gov.uk/acts/acts/2007/ukpga_20070020 en 1.

3.4 Accuracy of the information

The information in the marriage entry is largely supplied by the persons being married, who are responsible for its accuracy. Supplying false information may render them liable to prosecution for perjury and the information supplied is generally believed to be correct. There is no routine statistical verification of the data, although editing checks are carried out to detect clerical, coding and keying errors. However, certain corrections subsequently come to light and are notified and recorded by the GRO at Southport.

Each year a certain number of marriages are not included in the published figures because the entries have been received at ONS later than the date on which the annual dataset is taken. The majority of the shortfall is due to a delay in register offices submitting quarterly certified copies. Some of this delay is attributable to the clergy or authorised persons because register offices require the return of copies of the entries in the marriage register on a quarterly basis. **Table B** shows the differences between the number of marriages stored on our database and the number included in our publications each year. The differences reflect the marriage records which are received by ONS after the date that the annual dataset is taken. Although this means some marriages are not included in the statistics, it is a compromise which must be taken in order to publish timely data.

3.5 Corrections for missing information

If the age of one of the parties is not given, a value for that age based upon the other party's stated age is assigned, taking into account the combined marital condition of the parties. Where the ages of both parties are missing, the values assigned are those of the previous couple having the same pair of marital statuses. Few records require such imputation each year: in 2006 only 19 marriages required imputation.

Any other relevant item of information which appears to be omitted is queried, and corrected where appropriate.

3.6 Mean and median ages at marriage

Some of the age distributions shown in the tables in this volume have been summarised by calculating median and mean ages at marriage (**Tables 3.15** to **3.17**). The mean age (also known as the average age) is obtained by adding together the ages of all the people concerned and dividing by the number of people. By contrast the median age is the age of the person in the group, such that one half of the group is younger than that person and the other half is older.

The median and mean ages do not coincide here. This is because the age distribution is not symmetrical; marriage may take place at any age from 16 upwards but the majority occur much nearer 16 than, for example, 70. The effect is that the mean is greater than the median.

As the age recorded at marriage registration is the age at last birthday rather than the exact age, it has been assumed that the exact ages are evenly spread between successive single years of age.

The mean ages presented in this volume are not standardised for age and therefore take no account of the changing age structure of the population.

3.7 Nuptiality and cohort analyses

The statistics shown in this volume are based mainly on period figures and rates are calculated on a specific calendar time. An alternative approach is to look at rates based on the experience of a specific group of people born in the same calendar year, known as a birth *cohort* - these are cohort analyses.

A useful tool in demographic analysis is the life table, which, in its most common usage, is a statistical model to summarise current levels of mortality. In a life table, a synthetic cohort of persons is considered which gradually becomes depleted by deaths at current period rates. The model may be extended to the study of marriage patterns, to show the effects of current marriage rates. The rates used here are first marriage rates.

The results of the life table may be considered as a summary of a set of period rates, or as a type of projection. Thus, if current first marriage rates were to continue into the future, the life table shows the proportions that would eventually be married by a certain age - or the probability of staying single until this age. These tables can be constructed making different assumptions.

The simplest assumption is that the cohort is unaffected by mortality. This is equivalent to assuming that none of the cohort dies before passing through the marriageable ages. This is the basis of the gross nuptiality analysis, shown in **Table 3.21**.

If mortality is taken into account, the model becomes a multiple decrement table with similar features of measuring proportions remaining single, and giving expectations of the number of years remaining single. **Table 3.22** shows this net nuptiality.

The statistics in **Tables 3.21** and **3.22** have been derived from 'gross' and 'net' period nuptiality tables for 2006 calculated by ONS. The gross table is based entirely on first marriage rates, whereas the net table also allows for current mortality rates. The tables show what would happen if the first marriage rates in 2006 - and the mortality rates for 2006 in the case of the net table - were to remain unchanged for the lifetime of the synthetic cohort. The tables provide useful summaries of the overall patterns of a particular set of marriage rates, but can be misleading as projections. The rates occurring in a single calendar year may all be higher, or lower, than normal and a projection should include a considered assumption as to how the future may differ from the present.

When considering the results as a projection, the basic assumptions are that current rates of first marriage (and of mortality) remain unchanged, and that there is no migration of the population being considered.

Technical details

The gross table, **3.21**, was constructed from single year age-specific period first marriage rates M_x , with each sex being treated in isolation, as follows:

First, nuptiality probabilities, g_x , were calculated by using the standard formula, which assumes first marriages occurred evenly over each year of age, and throughout the year.

$$g_x = \frac{2.M_x}{2+M_x}$$

The *nuptiality probability* g_x is the probability of a person aged exactly x years marrying before they reach x + 1 years.

Then, starting with a hypothetical cohort of 1,000 single persons at age $16 (N_1 = 1,000)$ and assuming both a *closed*

population, that is no immigration or emigration, and no mortality, the proportion (per 1,000) ever married at exact age x was defined by the formula 1,000 - N.

where $N_x = N_{x-1} (1-g_{x-1})$ and N_x is the number of persons remaining single at exact age x from the original cohort of 1,000.

The other measure given in the table is an estimate of the average number of years until marriage at exact age x for persons marrying before age 50.

This was obtained from the *stationary population* (for a population to be stationary it must be assumed that the agespecific first marriage rates will remain at constant levels over time) of single persons in much the same way as the expectation of life is obtained in a life table. An important difference between a life table and a gross nuptiality table is that everybody dies whereas not everybody marries. As some 99 per cent of first marriages occur before age 50, it is customary to use this as an upper limit for the calculations in nuptiality tables. So when computing the number of years until marriage, the years lived by those who remained single at age 50 were excluded.

To calculate the average number of years spent single between age x and 50, first find the average number of single years lived between ages x and x + 1. This is given by:

Algebraically the steps were:

$$^{1}/_{2}\left[N_{x}+N_{x+1}\right]$$

Hence the average number of years before marriage at the exact age x for those ever marrying by age 50 is the sum of all the years lived single from age x to 50, less the years lived by those still single at 50, divided by the number that married between age x and 50. This is given by:

$$\frac{\sum_{i=x}^{49} \frac{1}{2} \left[N_{i} + N_{i+1} \right] - \left[50-x \right] N_{50}}{N_{x} - N_{50}}$$

The gross table does not allow for the decline in the number of single persons due to death. The net table, which like the gross table assumes a closed population, takes into account deaths of single persons between birth and exact age 50. Therefore the net table starts with a hypothetical cohort of 1,000 persons at birth and not at age 16 as in the gross table. Up to age 16 the hypothetical cohort is subjected to the mortality decrement at each age, so at 16 the number remaining alive is given by the life table function l(16). After age 16 it is subjected to the decrements of marriage and mortality.

In the net table 3.22, single year age-specific death rates for never-married persons were converted into death probabilities, q_x , assuming deaths at each age were evenly distributed, except at the early ages of life.

Those persons in the hypothetical cohort remaining alive at age 16 were subjected separately to the (life table) mortality rates q_x, and nuptiality probabilities g_x, to determine the number of deaths of single persons and the number of first marriages at each age in the stationary population. This works on the assumption that nobody who married in a particular year would have died single and those who died single cannot have married. Separate cumulation of these deaths and marriages yielded the proportions (per 1,000) of the hypothetical cohort who died single and married at each age and hence the proportion remaining single and alive was deduced. The net average number of years until marriage was computed as an arithmetic mean from the number of single person years lived by those who ever married between exact ages x and 50, using the same method as used for the gross nuptiality table.

The average age at marriage of the hypothetical cohort, for those marrying before age 50, can be readily derived from the gross or net tables by adding 16 years (the age below which everybody is single) to the figure in the 'mean number of years until marriage' column at exact age 16. In the net table for males, for example, this figure is 15.8 years and so the mean age at first marriage is 31.8 (= 15.8 + 16).

The *cohort analyses* in **Tables 3.36** and **3.37** offer different analyses of the population ever married and their longer term trends. They analyse first marriages separately for people of different birth cohorts, instead of considering first marriage rates year by year for the whole population, made up as it is of persons from many birth cohorts. There are obvious advantages in studying a cohort over time - for instance, with first marriages the proportions first marrying at higher ages are affected by those at younger ages, simply because a certain proportion will already have married. This is shown in **Table 3.36**. **Table 3.37** gives a similar analysis for remarriages.

A disadvantage of the method is that many cohorts of interest will not have 'completed' their marriage histories at any particular time. The tables illustrate this feature. However, it is possible to see trends for some cohorts, and estimate likely future rates, for projection purposes. Similar analyses are also carried out for births² and divorces (see **Table 4.8**); these have been studied elsewhere⁵.

3.8 New widowers and widows

Tables 5.1 to **5.3** analyse information about people who become widows or widowers in a particular calendar year. In 'stock-flow' terms this is an analysis of the gross inflow of married persons into this marital condition. Details of the 'stock' of widow(er)s are given in the population section (**Table 1.1**); details of remarriages of widow(er)s are given in the marriage section (for example in **Tables 3.12** to **3.14**).

Information about persons who become widow(er)s is available from the entry made at the registration of a death.

The marital status of the deceased person and the age of the surviving spouse have been available since 1938 as part of the confidential particulars collected under the Population (Statistics) Acts of that year and, later, the 1960 Act.

The marital status of a small proportion of people who die is not known, and the numbers of new widow(er)s may thus be slightly underestimated. Statistics of deceased people with unknown marital status are set out below (**Table C**) for the years 1996 to 2006. In all years the proportion of men with unknown marital status is greater than that for women.

OPCS began computerising the registration service in 1987. Under this system details supplied by the informant are entered onto a PC by the registrar of births and deaths, a draft death entry (shown in **Appendix C**) is printed, and

the information is then stored and sent weekly to ONS for processing. By January 1996, 86 per cent of deaths were registered at offices which had been computerised; by 2006 this figure was higher than 99 per cent. For offices which have not been computerised, the registration details are sent to ONS on paper, and the information keyed in.

Analysis by data source shows that the proportion of deaths with unknown marital status is lower for those registered at computerised offices than at offices not yet computerised (**Table C**). This is consistent over all years from 1996. As more registration offices have become computerised, so the overall proportion of deaths with unknown marital status has fallen. There is still room for improvement in the reporting of marital status, particularly for men, but, overall, the quality of these data is markedly better than in 1996.

4 Notes and definitions: divorces

4.1 Terminology

A marriage may be either

- dissolved, following a petition for divorce and the granting of a decree absolute
- annulled, following a petition for nullity and the awarding of a decree of nullity

The first group of decrees are known as dissolutions of marriage, and the second as annulments of marriage. For convenience, in this volume the term 'divorce' includes both types of decrees, although, strictly speaking, it should refer only to dissolutions. However, in England and Wales, dissolutions outnumber annulments by over 900 to 1. Annulments are distinguished separately in Tables 4.20 and 4.22.

4.2 Legislation

The Divorce Reform Act 1969 came into effect in England and Wales on 1 January 1971. The Act introduced a solitary ground for divorce - that of the irretrievable breakdown of marriage. The Act, subsequently consolidated in the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973, made it possible for the first time for divorce to be petitioned for on the couple's separation.

The Act attempted to remove the concepts of the 'guilty party' and the 'matrimonial offence' by introducing a single ground for divorce which was the 'irretrievable breakdown of marriage'. Such a breakdown can be established by the petitioner proving one or more of five 'facts', the first three of which adultery, unreasonable behaviour and desertion are the former matrimonial offences. There are certain quite substantial changes. On the other hand, the two separation criteria - which allow divorce either by mutual consent or on the application of the petitioner alone - were introduced for the first time by the Act and so have no analogues among the grounds for divorce under former legislation.

The Matrimonial and Family Proceedings Act 1984 came into effect in England and Wales on 12 October 1984. It made two main changes. The first concerned the time bar for divorce - the minimum interval of time which has to elapse between the date of marriage and that of being able to file a petition for divorce. Under the former Act the time bar was three years, although if a petitioner could prove they had suffered exceptional hardship or that the

respondent had exhibited exceptional depravity, a petition could be brought earlier. This discretionary time bar was replaced by an absolute time bar of one year. No petition can now be filed under any circumstances within the first year of marriage.

The second change was that the Act no longer required the courts to try to place the divorced spouses in the financial position they would have enjoyed, had the marriage not broken down. When considering orders for financial relief, courts are required to place greater emphasis on the desirability of the parties becoming self-sufficient.

4.3 Information collected

A copy of part of the form used to record a decree absolute, D105, which provides statistical information, is reproduced in **Appendix B**. These forms are supplied to ONS by the courts for processing and the production and analysis of statistics. More information on the contents of the form can be found in section **1.3**.

4.4 Accuracy of information

Much of the information is as supplied by the petitioner and respondent in fulfilling the legal requirements for filing a petition. Certain items of information are usually taken from the marriage certificate, but others are as stated by the petitioner. Since the information is required for a legal process it may be presumed that the quality of the data is good, especially as the petitioner has to swear an affidavit that the information supplied is correct. There is no routine independent statistical verification of the data, but editing checks are carried out to detect clerical, coding and keying errors.

Each year a certain number of divorces are not included in the published figures because the decree absolute forms have been received at ONS later than the date on which the annual dataset is taken. **Table D** shows the differences between the number of divorces stored on our database and the number included in our publications each year. The differences reflect the divorce records which are received by ONS after the date that the annual dataset is taken. Although this means some divorces are not included in the statistics, it is a compromise which must be taken in order to publish timely data.

4.5 Judicial separation, petitions filed and decrees made absolute

In this publication divorce analyses are compiled on the basis of decrees made absolute and decrees of nullity as derived from the D105 form received by ONS.

Information on petitions filed and decrees granted for judicial separation and on petitions filed and decree nisi granted for divorce or nullity are available only as an aggregate compiled by Ministry of Justice, as noted in Section 1.3. These data were supplied to ONS on 12 February 2008 and are shown in Tables 2.1 and 4.23. Analyses of petitions filed are also published in the volume *Judicial and Court Statistics*, referred to in section 1.3.

4.6 Derived information

Some information used in the tables is not part of the basic data supplied, but is derived as follows:

- Age at divorce is derived from age at marriage as given
 in the marriage entry. As this is the 'age last birthday',
 six months is added to obtain an estimate of the age at
 marriage. This is then added to the duration of marriage,
 which is calculated as the difference between the date of
 divorce and the date of marriage (in months and years).
 From this an estimated 'age last birthday' as at the date
 of divorce is derived.
- *Dependent children*: in this publication an upper age limit of 16 has been used.
- Age of child at petition is derived from date of birth of child and date of petition.
- *Duration of marriage* to decree absolute is derived from date of marriage and date of decree absolute.
- Length of time between petition and decree absolute is derived from date of petition and date of decree absolute.

4.7 Missing information and corrections

In a very few cases, one or more of the items of information collected is found to be missing. The procedure adopted in such cases is as follows:

- Age at marriage the figure is imputed using a series
 of look-up tables, depending on whether the age of one
 or both parties is missing. In 2006 there were 4 per cent
 of records where age of husband and/or age of wife
 was imputed.
- *Marital status at marriage* bridegrooms are assumed to be single men who have never been married, and brides are assumed to be single women who have never been married. Marital status was imputed for 6 per cent of records in 2006.
- Date of decree absolute assumed to be the same as on the previous decree absolute form processed.
- *Date petition filed* assumed to be exactly one year prior to the year of decree absolute.
- Date of marriage is very rarely missing, but where it is, the form will always be referred back to the court because if it is missing, fields derived from it cannot be calculated. **Table 4.1** shows the number of 'not stated' age at divorce due to missing information about date of marriage.
- *Other items* referred back to the divorce court in question.

4.8 Children of divorcing couples

In this volume, the analysis of children involved in divorce refers to children of the family, according to Section 52 of the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973. As well as children born to the couple divorcing, this term includes those born outside marriage, children of previous marriages and adopted children - provided that they were treated by both partners as children of their family.

In earlier years there was no upper age limit for children shown in the divorce tables, so some 'children' were of mature years and some 'couples with children' were couples all of whose children were adults. This practice changed in 1974 and in most tables children are now defined as being aged under 16. Some information is also given about children of any age. The distinction makes a sizeable difference to the numbers in some categories. Age 16 was chosen because it is the minimum school-leaving age and the minimum age at marriage. Details of the change were given in *Population Trends* 31⁶.

Some of the information on the decree absolute form refers to the position at the time the petition was filed, and is not updated when the decree is made absolute. In particular, the ages of any children are those as at the date of filing the petition, and *not* at the date of decree absolute. Age at petition is used as a closer approximation to when the marriage broke down. Therefore this may give a better indication of the age of children affected by marital breakdown ending in divorce. The interval between these dates can vary greatly - see **Table 4.22**. However, for petitions filed since 1 January 1977 the actual dates of birth of children aged under 18 have been recorded on the

decree absolute form. This means that the ages of children at decree absolute could be derived if needed for statistical purposes.

Tables 4.10 to 4.15 analyse divorces where there are children in the family. The first two tables in this group provide summaries of recent time trends and show the effect of including and excluding 'children' aged 16 or over. Thus a distinction is made between couples with children under age 16, couples all of whose children are 16 or over, and couples who are either childless or did not provide details of any children. The number of children and the number of couples are shown for each category. In Table 4.11 this information is supplemented by giving the number of couples by the number of children aged under 16 and age of child distributions for couples with children under age 16.

The remaining tables give more detailed cross tabulations for the current year for couples with children under age 16. **Table 4.12** provides data on the range of ages in each family which enables questions to be answered about the number of divorcing couples with children under (or over) a specified age. The age of wife at the time of the divorce is analysed in **Table 4.13** together with the number and ages of the children. **Table 4.14** is similar, but 'age of wife at marriage' replaces 'age of wife at divorce'. Finally, the duration of the marriage is shown, with age of wife at marriage and the number of children, in **Table 4.15**.

4.9 Fact proven at divorce

The Divorce Reform Act 1969, which was subsequently consolidated into the Matrimonial Causes Act 1973, was important in its attempt to remove the concept of the 'guilty party' and the 'matrimonial offence' by introducing a solitary ground for divorce which was the 'irretrievable breakdown of marriage'. Such a breakdown can be established by the petitioner proving one or more of five 'facts', the first three of which (adultery, unreasonable behaviour, and desertion) are the former matrimonial offences.

On the other hand, the two other facts (which rely solely on the couple's separation) were introduced for the first time by the Act. These allow divorce either by mutual consent after two years' separation, or by the petitioner, without the consent of the respondent, after five years' separation. Thus they have no analogues amongst the grounds for divorce under former legislation (see section 4.2).

Table 4.20 analyses the fact proven by the party to whom the divorce was granted - first, for cases where the petition was granted to only one party, and second, where it was granted jointly to both parties.

4.10 Orders made concerning children in family proceedings

Section 8 of the Children Act 1989 makes provision for the orders listed below. Applications for section 8 orders can be made in Family Proceedings Courts (FPCs), County Courts or the High Court. FPCs (which cannot hear divorce cases and section 8 cases which are complex) may transfer proceedings to an appropriate county court. If there are matrimonial proceedings pending or recently heard, then it will usually be appropriate for the Children Act proceedings to be brought to the same court.

- Contact order: requires the person with whom a child lives, or is to live, to allow the child to visit or stay with the person named in the order, or for that person and the child otherwise to have contact with each other. The parent with whom the child lived is thus responsible for making this order work.
- Prohibited steps order: no step which could be taken by
 a parent in meeting their parental responsibility for a
 child, and which is of a kind specified in the order, shall
 be taken by any person without the consent of the court.
 An example here might be to prohibit a parent from
 changing a child's surname.
- Residence order: settles the arrangements to be made as
 to the person with whom a child is to live. It is possible
 for the court to make a 'shared' residence order in favour
 of two or more persons who live in different households.
- Specific issue order: gives directions for the purpose
 of determining a specific question which has arisen,
 or which may arise, in connection with any aspect of
 parental responsibility for a child. This might apply, for
 instance, to the issue of which school a child should
 attend.

Table 4.24 analyses trends in these types of order.

4.11 Divorce rates by marital status at marriage

Table 4.19 analyses divorce rates by the marital status of a person before entering into marriage. Prior to marriage a person may be either single, widowed or divorced. However, population estimates are not available for the married population by previous marital status of husband and wife in combination. Thus the rates in this table show the number of divorces in England and Wales in 2006 by certain stated years married per 1,000 marriages in the same years. For example, 32 out of every 1,000 marriages that were solemnised between 1995 and 1999, where the groom was aged between 20 and 24 and single before marriage, ended in divorce in 2006. The corresponding rate for men marrying between 1970 and 1974 was 3. The denominator for 'All years' is the total number of marriages between 1940 and 2005.

The most recent group of years for year of marriage is not a full five-year age group. It is therefore not comparable with earlier year groups, but is included to show the most up-to-date information. It also impacts upon the 'All years' rate.

Divorce rates for widow(er)s aged under 30 are subject to large variations year on year, as they are based on few events. This is because the number of widow(er)s marrying each year is small. Rates for men and women aged under 20 who were divorced at the time of marriage are similarly affected.

In addition, for the purpose of calculating rates, it is assumed that those divorcing in England and Wales were married in England or Wales. This will not always be true. Also, a couple that marry in England or Wales may choose to divorce in another country. The fact that a marriage or divorce has taken place in England or in Wales does not mean that either one or both parties are resident there.

5 Notes and definitions: adoptions

5.1 Legislation and procedures

On 30 December 2005, the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (the 2002 Act) was fully implemented. It replaced the Adoption Act 1976 and modernised the legal framework for adoption in England and Wales. The 2002 Act provides for an adoption order to be made in favour of single people, married couples and, for the first time, civil partners, and unmarried couples (whether of different sexes or the same sex) living as partners in an enduring family relationship.

The 2002 Act provides for a partner or civil partner of a child's parent to adopt the child without having to adopt jointly with the child's parent. The child's parent does not lose parental responsibility though the other birth parent does lose parental responsibility. This provision applies equally to spouses.

The 2002 Act introduced Special Guardianship as a new legal permanence option for children who cannot live with their birth families, but for whom adoption is not suitable.

Adoption orders are made by the High Court, County Courts and Magistrates' Courts. The order granting an adoption contains a direction to the Registrar General to make an entry in the Adopted Children Register recording particulars of the adopted child and the adoptive parent(s) that are set out in the order. Before granting an order, the court examines a certificate of the child's original birth entry.

The order is the only document which contains details of a child's birth identity and his or her identity after adoption. The Registrar General has a statutory obligation under the 2002 Act to maintain the confidentiality of adoption records by prohibiting access to the information.

The particulars recorded in the Adopted Children Register include the child's date and place of birth, their sex and new name, the names, occupations and address of the adoptive parents, the date of the order and the description of the court by which the order was made.

The Adopted Children Register also contains some registrations of overseas adoptions. Part 2 of the Adopted Children and Adoption Contact Register Regulations 2005 allows for the adoptive parent(s), who were habitually resident in England or Wales, to apply to include children who were born and adopted overseas. Adoptive parents whose children were born in England or Wales (and for whom the General Register Office holds a birth registration) but were adopted overseas may also make an application.

The 2002 Act provides for adults who were adopted before 30 December 2005 to apply to the Registrar General for a copy of their original birth certificate. People who were adopted prior to 12 November 1975 are required to attend birth records counselling in order to be given the information necessary to obtain a copy of their birth certificate. Counselling is optional, but recommended, for those adopted on or after 12 November 1975 but before 30 December 2005.

The 2002 Act makes further provision for an adopted adult to apply for access to their birth records from the adoption agency that dealt with the adoption, or if that agency no longer exists, from the agency which holds the records.

The 2002 Act introduced new rights for adopted adults (adopted before 30 December 2005) and their adult birth relatives to apply for an intermediary service. This means that an adopted adult can ask an intermediary agency to obtain information about their adoption and/or to trace an adult birth relative and establish if contact would be welcome. Similarly, an adult birth relative can ask an intermediary agency to trace and facilitate contact with an adopted adult. Intermediary services maybe provided by registered Adoption Support Agencies and by some registered adoption societies (also known as voluntary adoption agencies) and local authorities.

5.2 Information collected

Information on adoption analysed in this volume is collected under the 2002 Act and from a number of sources. Details of adoption orders (**Appendices D** and **E**) are provided by one or other of the High Court, County Court, or Magistrates' Court directly to the General Register Office.

5.3 Accuracy of the information

The numbers of adoption orders by date of court order, as shown in **Tables 6.1b** and **6.2b**, are subject to revision in later volumes due to the likely additions of late registrations. These revisions to the data could extend back a number of years in each annual reference volume.

5.4 Corrections for missing information

Imputations are not usually made for missing information in adoptions data. In 1998, however, the parents' marital status was imputed, as it was found that due to a data entry error, a third of all adoption records had no parents' marital status at birth recorded.

Therefore **Tables 6.1a** and **6.1b** show no records with marital status 'not stated' in 1998. The imputation method used compared the natural mother's surname with the natural father's surname. If the surnames matched exactly, the system assumed legitimacy; if they were different, it assumed the child had been born outside marriage. This imputation method was checked against data where the parents' marital status was known and was found to be accurate for 98 per cent of all records.

5.5 Adoption orders

Data on adoptions are derived from the Adopted Children Register, and are based on adoption orders made in England and Wales as well as some overseas adoptions. Historically, the data have related to those cases notified by the courts to the Registrar General and entered on the Adopted Children Register in a given year. However, for the first time, the 1999 volume additionally included adoptions data by date of court order of adoption. Subsequent volumes also include data on this basis.

Glossary

Adopted Children Register (ACR) The ACR is maintained at GRO, in which entries relating to adopted children are made

as directed by adoption orders.

Adoption Order Gives parental responsibility for a child to the adoptive parent(s), made on their

application by an authorised court.

Approved Adoption Society A body of persons whose functions consist of, or include, the making of arrangements for

the adoption of children. It must be approved by the Secretary of State for Health. In 2005 it would have been approved by Secretary of State for Health. However, from 1 April 2007

the regulator for this has been the Office for Standards in Education (OFSTED).

Approved Premises Under the Marriage Act 1994, civil marriages can be solemnised in approved premises

(other than register offices). The Marriages & Civil Partnership (Approved Premises) Regulations 2005 allow for premises to be approved by a local authority for the solemnization of marriages and the formation of civil partnerships. These include

hotels, stately homes and historic buildings.

Annual Reference Volume ARVs are yearly publications produced by ONS for a variety of topics (for example,

FM2 for marriage, divorce and adoption).

Annulment An annulment of marriage occurs following a successful petition for nullity. It declares

that the marriage itself is void and that no valid marriage ever existed or voidable (was

legal at time of registration but is no longer legal.

Authorised Person An Authorised Person is appointed by the Registrar General to register marriages

solemnised in a named registered building in a duplicate register.

Banns A marriage in the Church of England or Church of Wales requires the publication of

banns of marriage on three Sundays preceding it. Banns ask for public confirmation

that the parties involved are legally eligible for marriage.

Civil Marriage A civil marriage can take place at a register office or other buildings approved for

civil marriage. The bride and bridegroom must personally give a formal notice of their intention to marry to the superintendent registrar of the district(s) where they have resided for the previous seven days. If either party is subject to immigration control then notice of marriage must be given at a designated register office. Both parties must

attend together. There are 76 designated register offices in England and Wales.

Civil Partnership Dissolution A dissolution of civil partnership occurs following the presentation of an application

and the granting of a final order and ends a valid civil partnership. To obtain a civil partnership dissolution in the UK, a couple must have been in either a registered civil

partnership or recognised foreign relationship for 12 months.

Civil Partnership The Civil Partnership Act 2004 came into force on 5 December 2005 in the UK, the first

day couples could give notice of their intention to form a civil partnership. The Act enables same-sex couples aged 16 and over to obtain legal recognition of their relationship. The first day that couples could normally form a partnership was 19 December in Northern Ireland,

20 December in Scotland and 21 December in England and Wales.

Decree Absolute Granted upon a dissolution of marriage following a petition for divorce, a decree

absolute ends a valid marriage. See Dissolution.

Decree Nisi Following the grounds for divorce being proven, the district judge grants a decree nisi

as a provisional measure. Six weeks later the petitioner can apply for a decree absolute.

Decree of Nullity Granted upon an annulment of marriage following a petition for nullity, a decree of

nullity declares that the marriage itself is void and that no valid marriage ever existed.

See Annulment.

Department of Constitutional

Affairs (DCA)

Prior to 9 May 2007, the DCA was responsible, among other things, for the administration of the court system in England and Wales through the Court Service.

See Her Majesty's Court service.

Dissolution A dissolution of marriage occurs following a successful petition for divorce and ends a

valid marriage. Dissolution of marriage covers nullity and divorce. See Decree Absolute.

Facts Proven A petitioner must prove one or more of five facts (adultery, unreasonable behaviour,

desertion, and separation, either with or without consent of the respondent) in order to

establish the irretrievable breakdown of the marriage.

First Release Once an annual dataset from a particular source such as marriage registration has

been quality assured, its first publication is referred to as a First Release. This is

accompanied by a news, or press, release which details the main findings.

General Register Office (GRO) The GRO (part of the Identity and Passport Service since 1 April 2008) is responsible

for ensuring the registration of all births, deaths, marriages and civil partnerships that

have occurred in England and Wales and for maintaining a central archive.

Her Majesty's Court Service Her Majesty's Court Service is an executive agency of the Ministry of Justice and is

responsible for the running of most of the courts and tribunals in England and Wales. Her Majesty's Court Service supplies information on divorces and adoptions to ONS.

Judicial Separation This is an alternative to divorce and does not dissolve the marriage but absolves the

parties from the obligation to live together. This procedure might, for instance, be used

if religious beliefs forbid or discourage divorce.

Judicial and Court Statistics This Annual Report of the Ministry of Justice shows statistics which relate to the

criminal and civil business of those courts in England and Wales, including data on

divorce and adoption.

Lord Chancellor's Department Prior to 12 June 2003 and constitutional reforms, the LCD was responsible for the

administration of the court system in England and Wales through the Court Service.

Ministry of Justice Following constitutional reforms, the Ministry of Justice was created on 9 May 2007

replacing the DCA. It is responsible, among other things, for the administration of the

court system in England and Wales through the Court Service.

National Statistics Code of Practice The principles and protocols followed and upheld by all those involved in producing

National Statistics.

News Release A news, or press, release details the findings in a First Release.

Nuptiality Collective term for marriage, separation, divorce, widowhood and remarriage which is

commonly used by demographers to refer to the propensity of a population to get married.

ONS Since 1 April 2008, Office for National Statistics (ONS) is the executive office of the

UK Statistics Authority.

OPCS Office of Population Censuses and Surveys - joined with Central Statistical Office in

1996 to become ONS.

Petitioner The person seeking a dissolution or annulment.

Population Trends A quarterly ONS publication which covers population and demographic information,

including articles and reports on marriages, divorces and adoptions.

Registrar Local Authority employee responsible for the registration of births, deaths and marriages.

Registrar General Statutory appointment with responsibility for the administration of the registration acts in

England and Wales, and other related functions as specified by the relevant legislation.

Registration Officer Generic term for registrar, superintendent registrar and additional registrars.

Registration Scheme Organises the boundaries and specifies the name of registration districts within local

authorities.

Religious Marriage Religious marriages can take place in Church of England or Church in Wales premises,

as well as in other buildings registered for marriage which are certified as a place of worship. Religious marriages also include marriages solemnised according to the rites

of the Society of Friends and those professing the Jewish religion.

Reports Regular articles in Population Trends on marriage and divorce (based on registration

data, soon after they become available).

Respondent The person to whom a petition for divorce has been served.

Single Men/Women Persons who have never been married or been in a civil partnership.

Superintendent Registrar Local Authority employee with responsibilities relating to marriage and other

registration functions, as specified in the relevant legislation.




