FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST REFERENCE NO: 785.2019-20

I write in connection with your request for information which was received by North Yorkshire Police on 19 October 2019. Please accept our apologies for the delay in providing you with a response. I note you seek access to the following information:

1. *How many police officers are currently trained to use of a Taser.*
2. *Which departments/units (i.e. Roads Policing/Neighbourhood Policing) contain officers who carry Tasers.*
3. *Do you intend to increase the number of Taser trained officers over the next 12 months.*
4. *If so, by how many.*
5. *Are Tasers issued to any officer who wish's to undergo the training required.*

Extent and Result of Searches to Locate Information

To locate the information relevant to your request searches were conducted within North Yorkshire Police.

I can confirm that the information you have requested is held by North Yorkshire Police.

Decision

I have today decided to disclose the located information to you.

1. The number of police offices currently trained to use a Taser is 239, plus the Firearms officers.

The number of Firearms Officers is published on the Home Office website via the following link.

A separate figure is exempt pursuant to **Section 21 – Information Reasonably Accessible by other Means**.

2. The trained Officers are within the following departments:

- Response,
- Road Policing,
- Dog Section,
- Operational Support Units,
- Rural Task Forces.
- Investigation Hub
- Firearms

3. A review is being conducted as to whether there is a requirement/need for any additional training.

4. Please see question 3.

5. Training is given to relevant Officers within the relevant departments and Tasers are only available to those trained Officers.

Please note that systems used for recording information are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the data. It should be noted therefore that this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other responses you may receive.

COMPLAINT RIGHTS

Are you unhappy with how your request has been handled or do you think the decision is incorrect?

You have the right to request that North Yorkshire Police review their decision.

Prior to lodging a formal complaint you are welcome and encouraged to discuss the decision with the case officer that dealt with your request.

Ask to have the decision looked at again –

The quickest and easiest way to have the decision looked at again is to telephone the case officer that is nominated at the end of your decision letter.

That person will be able to discuss the decision, explain any issues and assist with any problems.

Complaint

If you are dissatisfied with the handling procedures or the decision North Yorkshire Police made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) regarding access to information you can lodge a complaint with North Yorkshire Police to have the decision reviewed. North Yorkshire Police must be notified of your intention to complain within 2 months of the date of its response to your Freedom of Information request. Complaints should be made in writing and addressed to:

In all possible circumstances North Yorkshire Police will aim to respond to your complaint as soon as practicable but within 20 working days.

The Information Commissioner

After lodging a complaint with North Yorkshire Police if you are still dissatisfied with the decision you may make application to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether the request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the requirements of the Act.
