Dear Mr van Lerven

Thank you for your email of 9 September.

As we explained in our initial response, the general right of access to information contained in the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('Fol Act') does not apply to information held by the Bank of England (the 'Bank') in respect of its functions with respect to monetary policy. The term 'monetary policy' is a broad one and it covers a number of the Bank's key functions because of the role the Bank plays in promoting monetary and financial stability. Targeting inflation is the main objective of monetary policy but we also have a secondary statutory monetary policy objective set out in the Bank of England Act 1998 which is to support the Government's economic objectives, including for growth and employment. In order to carry out its functions, the Bank uses economic and financial information from a wide range of sources. Information obtained and analysed by the Bank for the purposes of monetary policy, such as the granular information you have requested, therefore falls outside the scope of the Fol Act altogether because of the monetary policy exclusion noted above.
