**PAY REVIEW 1985 - REVISED PAY RATES, ALLOWANCES AND CHARGES FOR THE REGULAR ARMY,
TA AND UDR**

Reference A: D/Sec 2(A)/48/28/1 dated 25 June 1984

1. I am commanded by the Army Board of the Defence Council to inform you of changes in rates of pay, additional pay, allowances and charges following acceptance by HM Government of the recommendations of the Armed Forces Pay Review Body in its Fourteenth Report 1985, published as Command Paper 9526. The revised rates, which supersede those notified in Reference A are contained in the annexes attached to this letter; they are effective from the date indicated in each annex. Information on points of special concern is given below.

PAY

Medical and Dental Officers and Senior Officers

2. The pay of medical and dental officers in the rank of Brigadier and below will be published in a separate letter in due course, as will revised pay rates for combatant and medical and dental officers in the rank of Major General and above (excluding the Chaplain General).

Brigade of Gurkhas

3. Revised rates of UK addition effective from 1 April 1985 for officers and soldiers of the Brigade of Gurkhas will be published in due course.

Army Cadet Force and Combined Cadet Forces

4. Revised rates of pay effective from 1 April 1985 for officers and soldiers of the Army Cadet Force and the Combined Cadet Force will be published separately.

Territorial Army - Pay for Drill Nights

5. With effect from 1 April 1985 Territorial Army personnel will be eligible to receive pay for drill nights. Full details will be promulgated separately in due course.

Special Communications Pay

6. With effect from 1 April 1985 Special Communications Pay (SCP) will be paid to Radio Telegraphists serving with 602 Signal Troop who are trained in Special Communications. Radio Telegraphists (SC) will be eligible to receive SCP with effect from the satisfactory completion of Special Communications training, and will remain eligible subject to their Commanding Officer being satisfied that they remain fully qualified for Special Communications duties. SCP will, with effect from 1 April 1985, be paid at the following daily rates:

Signalman to Corporal	£3.00
Sergeant to WO1	£4.00

The terms of Pay Warrant Article 473 shall apply to this form of additional pay.

CHARGES

7. The personnel referred to in paragraph 2 are to continue to pay food and accommodation charges at the existing rates until their new pay rates are promulgated. The levels of Charges contained in the annexes to this letter will then be applied retrospectively from the effective date of their pay award.

Accommodation Charges

8. The system of classifying accommodation as "Standard" or "Sub-Standard" lapsed on 31 March 1985; it has been replaced by a new four-tier structure which reflects more adequately the range of accommodation that is available. Each until of married and single accommodation has been graded according to its quality and environment, from Grade 1 (the highest) to Grade 4 (the lowest). The gradings have been determined by allocating points for certain deficiencies, on the basis that the greater the deficiencies, the lower the grading.

9. The changes applicable to the new graded structure are generally effective from 1 April 1985. The revised charges, including rates for furnished and unfurnished married accommodation, are set out in Annex H(3). Officers in the groups referred to at paragraph 2 of this letter will continue to pay the existing rates of accommodation charges until the pay of these groups has been settled. The new changes will then be applied retrospectively from the effective date of pay awards for these groups.

Sub-Standard Accommodation Reclassified as Grade 3 or 2

10. The new grading system has resulted in some sub-standard accommodation being classified as Grade 3 or Grade 2. Those in accommodation previously classified as sub-standard who face increases in charges because of this upward shift in classification will be permitted to pay the new charges in stages. The charges for the first stage from 1 April 1985 to 31 March 1986 are set out in Annex H(5). The arrangements for staging after 31 March 1986 will be promulgated in a separate letter.

11. Throughout the staging period, the charge will apply to the accommodation, not the individual; this means that an officer or soldier moving into accommodation which was previously designated sub-standard will pay the staged charges applicable to that accommodation.

Effect of Regrading System on Regulations

12. Where "Standard Accommodation" is referred to in the current regulations governing the allowance in paragraph 8 above this will now be deemed to mean "Grade 1 accommodation". Further guidance will be issued on changes to regulations required as a result of the re-classification of accommodation.

OTHER CHANGES

Refund of Life Assurance Premium Loadings for Service Risks

13. The maximum "total sum assured" in respect of which partial refund of premiums may be claimed is increased to £51,000 with effect from 1 April 1985.

GENERAL

14. A key to the annexes is attached. In the case where a rate, allowance or charge does not appear in the annexes and its absence is not explained in this letter, you are to assume that there has been no change and that the existing level will continue to apply.

15. The Pay Warrant 1964, the Regulations for Army Allowances and Charges, the Regulations for the Territorial Army 1978 and the Regulations for the Ulster Defence Regiment 1980 will be amended as soon as possible.
