**PAY REVIEW 1986 - REVISED PAY RATES, ALLOWANCES AND CHARGES FOR THE
REGULAR ARMY, TA AND UDR**

References:

- A. D/AG Sec 2/48/29/1 dated 27 June 1985
- B. D/AG Sec 2/48/30/3 dated 30 June 1986

1. I am directed to inform you of changes in rates of pay, additional pay, allowances and charges following Government consideration of the Armed Forces Pay Review Body's Fifteenth Report 1986, published as Command Paper 9784. The revised rates, which supersede those notified in Reference A, are set out in the annexes attached to this letter. They are effective from 1 July 1986.

PAY

Medical and Dental Officers

2. The pay of medical and dental officers in the rank of Brigadier and below will be published in a separate letter in due course.

Senior Officers

3. Revised rates of pay for combatant and medical and dental officers in the rank of Major General and above (excluding the Chaplain General) are promulgated at Reference B.

Brigade of Gurkhas

4. Revised rates of UK addition effective from 1 July 1986 for officers and soldiers of the Brigade of Gurkhas will be published separately.

Army Cadet Force and Combined Cadet Forces

5. Revised rates of pay effective from 1 July 1986 for officers and soldiers of the Army Cadet Force and the Combined Cadet Force will be published separately.

Territorial Army - Pay for nights other than Drill Nights

6. With effect from 1 July 1986 Territorial Army personnel will be eligible to receive pay for nights other than drill nights. Full details will be promulgated separately.

7. Diving Pay

Army Advanced Divers (AAD) are now eligible to receive diving pay under category 3 and Army Diving Supervisors (ADS) and Army Diving Instructors (ADI) under Category 4. The daily rates of diving pay are set out in Annex C.

8. Pay for Work in Unpleasant Conditions

Officers and soldiers employed on duties in particularly unpleasant conditions may receive Pay for Work in Unpleasant Conditions at the rate of £0.35 per day. The award of this additional pay will require prior Ministry of Defence approval. The type of work for which this may be approved is, for example, prolonged working in hot and confined spaces, cementing in winds of at least 40 knots, or working with lime. This form of additional pay will be admissible only for those days on which the officer or soldier performs the duties for which it is granted.

CHARGES

9. The personnel referred to in paragraph 2 are to continue to pay food and accommodation charges at the existing rates until their new pay rates are promulgated. The letter promulgating their revised rates of pay will incorporate advice on the implementation of revised charges.

Accommodation Charges - Staging

10. The four tier grading system introduced on 1 April 1985 resulted in some sub-standard accommodation being classified as Grade 3 or Grade 2. To reduce the effect of the increase on those servicemen whose accommodation falls into these categories, staging arrangements were agreed. Charges for the first stage from 1 April 1985 to 31 March 86 were set out in Annex H(5) of Reference A. Revised charges for the second stage, to take effect from 1 July 86, are set out in Annex H(5) of this letter. Arrangements for the third and final stage will be promulgated in due course.

11. Throughout the staging period, the charge will apply to the accommodation, not the individual, this means that an officer or soldier moving into accommodation which was previously designated sub-standard will pay the staged charges applicable to that accommodation.

12. Where "Standard Accommodation" is referred to in the current regulations this will now be deemed to mean "Grade 1 Accommodation".

OTHER CHARGES

Refund of Life Assurance Premium Loadings for Service Risks

13. The maximum "total sum assured" in respect of which partial refund of premiums may be claimed has been raised to £55,000 with effect from 1 July 1986.

GENERAL

14. A key to the annexes is attached. In the case where a rate, allowance or charge does not appear in the annexes and its absence is not explained in this letter, you are to assume that there has been no change and that the existing level will continue to apply.

15. The Pay Warrant 1964, the Regulations for Army Allowances and Charges, the Regulations for the Territorial Army 1978 and the Regulations for the Ulster Defence Regiment 1980 will be amended as soon as possible.
