## **Bonuses paid to PPF employees**

Thank you for your e-mail of 30 December 2009. Your request has been considered as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("FoIA")<sup>1</sup>.

You asked

"Dear Pension Protection Fund,
I would like to know what bonuses were paid to P.P.F. employees for every year until
2009.

All costs associated with staff, including salaries and bonus payments are paid from the Pension Protection Fund's (the PPF's) administration budget. This is raised via the Administration Levy and is separate from the Pension Protection Levy. The Administration Levy pays for the ongoing administrative costs of the PPF. Schemes pay an amount per scheme member, which varies according to the total size of the scheme. The Department for Work and Pensions consults annually on the regulations providing for the amount payable, which is then set by statutory instrument.

The remuneration levels of executive members of the Board of the PPF are set out in the Annual Report and Accounts published by the PPF each year. Both salary and pension entitlements are published in each Annual Report within bands of £5,000 including bonuses.

The duty to confirm or deny whether the public authority holds information does not arise in these circumstances.

Staff numbers at the PPF have increased year on year from 2005/06 following completion of the build phase of the PPF and the start of its live operations. The number of staff employed by the PPF are set out in the Annual Report and Accounts for each financial year. These numbers are calculated by averaging the headcount across the year.
