3. Please describe how this grant made a difference to local people?

The Thrive Grant has made a tremendous difference to Stamford Park. Council funding had been reduced to the point that only one flower bed in the whole park was ear-marked for planting and only with annuals. This would have left most of the traditional, large flowerbeds looking bare and neglected. With the funding we have been able to develop four amazing floral displays

- A Prairie Garden at one of the main entrances
- A Cottage Garden beside the bowling greens
- A Rose Garden next to the central pathway
- School Competition beds beside the pond

We have planted perennial plants that will provide enjoyment year after year.

We have been able to involve a wide range of the community in planning and planting the new gardens – local school children, teenagers from the National Citizenship Scheme, local residents & members of the Friends of Stamford Park. We were judged by North West in Bloom and were delighted to hear that we have been awarded an award (level to be announced at an award ceremony in October – letter attached).

4. In addition to the funding awarded through the Voluntary Sector Grant scheme, did your project bring in any additional support?

In the original proposal we recognised in advance that we were undertaking a very ambitious project so we said we would raise a further £1,000 funding to allow us to really make an impact in the park. We managed to secure funding as follows:

6. Is this project or activity going to continue after the funding has ended?

We have been unable to fully implement the planned Japanese Garden as the Japanese Gardening Society visited the site and advised us that the types of plants required would not thrive in this location. We have cleared the area of the unsightly conifers and we will be using the additional funding raised to install a new planting scheme in Spring 2015.

There has been a delay in implementing the Sensory Garden as we were waiting for groundwork funding. This has now been achieved and we will be progressing the work in Spring 2015, again using the additional funding.

We will be continuing to maintain the flowerbeds to ensure they are free from weeds and the plants remain well tended for.

Section D: Project Outcomes

7. Looking back, which of your projects achievements are you most proud of and why?

The Rose Garden. We involved 20 teenagers from the National Citizenship Scheme. They were fully engaged in the planning the design of the Rose Garden and researching which roses to purchase. They then did the hard labour of digging out the beds, enriching the soil and then planting the roses. It was a real team effort and we were all extremely proud of the results.

The Schools Competition Beds has been a fantastic community element of the project. We were able to get three local primary schools to participate. The children planned their planting schemes and then came to the park to plant their beds. The wider school communities ensured the beds were watered and weeded in the following weeks. All three schools came to the park in July when the Altrincham in Bloom Judges decided which trophies (platinum, gold & silver) were to be awarded to the schools.

8. Is there anything that didn't go as expected? Would you do anything differently if you were starting again?

At times we have found it difficult to find volunteers to undertake some of the heavy duty weeding and planting sessions. This has meant that the Friends of Stamford Park committee had to become more involved. "Our Altrincham" is helping us access a wider population of potential volunteer gardeners. If we were starting again we would canvass a wider network of volunteers.

Receiving the news from the Japanese Gardening Society was very disappointing. In hindsight we should have discussed with them first. We are now researching what plants will thrive best in this location so we achieve a good outcome.

9. As a result of this project and funding, what is next for the project/your group?

Stamford Park has looked glorious this year and we wish it to look just as amazing every year.

There will be ongoing maintenance needed for the Rose Garden, Prairie Garden and the Cottage Garden. The local community group "Our Altrincham" are in the process of setting up a Gardening Club and part of their remit will be helping to keep our three Gardens in a beautiful condition.

Following this year's success we will be inviting the local schools to take part in the School Beds Competition again.

As per the response in question 6 we will be progressing work on the Sensory Garden and Japanese Garden site using our additional funding.
