Dear Sir/Madam,

Re: Information Request – Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000

Thank you for your email dated 11 July 2022 requesting the following information:

“Please could you provide the total annual cost for providing/hosting the Data Protection & Security Toolkit - To include all costs relating to non staff and staff cost and total value of any third party contractors helping to provision the availability of the system/service”

We have considered your request and in accordance with S.1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) I can confirm that we do hold the information that you have requested.

The ***total annual cost in 20-21 for providing/hosting the Data Protection & Security Toolkit*** was £1.62m, comprising staff cost of £1.32m and non-pay cost of £0.3m. Of the non-pay cost £0.26m relates to the activities of third-party contractors.

As such, whilst NHS Digital holds information in relation to 2021-22 onwards, we are withholding this under section 22 of the FOIA.

Section 22 sets out that information is exempt from disclosure if it is intended for future publication, and it is reasonable to withhold the information until it is published.

This data is published regularly as part of our routine publications.

We would expect data for 2021-22 to be available in the Autumn. We are therefore satisfied that there is a clear intention to publish the requested information.

Section 22 is a qualified exemption. This means that we are required to consider whether the public interest is in favour of maintaining the exemption (i.e., withholding the information), or releasing the information.

As this is part of a routine publication, there are established processes and procedures associated with the production of the information. Early disclosure would result in a piecemeal dataset, perhaps not reflective of the final product. This would also cause unnecessary confusion and disruption. We have also considered whether there is any particular public interest which could only be met by the early release of this information. As disclosure is scheduled the Autumn, we do not find it to be in the public interest to release earlier in the year.

We are therefore satisfied that the public interest is in favour of withholding the information.

Disclosure log

In line with the Information Commissioner's guidance on the disclosure of information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 your request will form part of our disclosure log. Therefore, a version of our response which will protect your anonymity will be posted on the NHS Digital website.

I trust you are satisfied with our response to your request for information. However, if you are not satisfied, you may request a review from a suitably qualified member of staff not involved in the initial query, via the enquiries@nhsdigital.nhs.uk email address or by post at the above postal address.
