#### **FOREWORD**

The annual report for the year ended 31st March 1999 has been prepared by the Trustee of the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund under Section 45 of The Charities Act, 1993. The content of the report is regulated by Statutory Instrument 1995 No. 2724, Charities.

During the 1998 – 1999 financial year the Charities Commission approved the single umbrella registration of Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund. The new charity was established by the merger of the existing umbrella registrations of the Pembrokeshire NHS Trust Charitable Fund and the Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund. Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust is the Corporate Trustee of the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund.

For the purposes of financial comparison, the prior year figures in the enclosed financial statements and associated notes are the consolidated accounts of the Pembrokeshire NHS Trust Charitable Fund and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund.

# LEGAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

a. The full name of the charity is:

d. The governing document of the charity is a declaration of trust in a format approved by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales.

The objects of the charity are:

The trustees shall hold the trust fund upon trust to apply the income, and at their discretion so far as permissible, the capital, for any charitable purpose or purposes relating to the National Health Service.

e. The trustee of the charity during the period covered by the annual report for the year ended 31st March 1999 is the corporate body of Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust. The role of trustee however, was essentially performed by the Trust Board of Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust.

- f. The assets of the charity are detailed in the Annual Accounts that follow. No assets are held on behalf of the charity by another charity or by a trustee of the charity.
- g. During the 1998 1999 financial year the Charity has retained the services of Barclays Bank, Haverfordwest.

NatWest Stockbrokers perform the function of Investment Advisers for investments held on behalf of the former Pembrokeshire NHS Trust Charitable Fund.

The Charity's auditors during the financial year were **PricewaterhouseCoopers**. PricewaterhouseCoopers was formed on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1998 as a result of the merger of Coopers & Lybrand, the Charity's auditor prior to this date, and Price Waterhouse.

### **ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS**

#### a. Registration

Following approval by the Charity Commission, registration of the new Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust umbrella charity was completed during the 1998-1999 financial year. This was achieved via a three stage transition process:

- 1. The former Pembrokeshire NHS Trust Charitable fund was renamed Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund.
- Governing documents for special purpose charities under the direction of both former charities were amended to place them under the direction of the new umbrella charity.
- 3. The former Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund was dissolved and all property was transferred to the new charity.

There are eight special purpose charities registered under the direction of the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund:

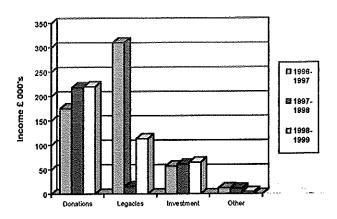

Pembrokeshire Ambulance Services Trust Fund

St David's Hospital Patient's Equipment

With effect from 1st April 1998 the newly formed Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust assumed responsibility for those ambulance services previously provided by the Pembrokeshire NHS Trust. The transfer of the registered Pembrokeshire Ambulance Services Trust Fund and a proportion of general funds is still to be finalised and is the subject of continued discussion between the Charity Commissioners, the newly formed Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust, and the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust

#### b. Income

The trustees are extremely grateful to those members of the public and staff who have made contributions to the charitable funds during the last financial year.

#### i Donations

In any given financial year the majority of income received is from donations. In 1998-1999 the total income received from donations amounted to £220,000.

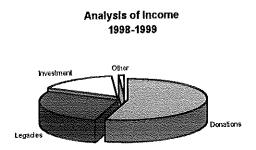
Included in this total are various substantial donations from individuals, in particular for Wards 10 and the Coronary Care Unit on Ward 8, and from local organisations such as the Line Dancing Club, Haverfordwest Services Club, the League of Friends, the ROAB and Oakwood Leisure.

Various hospital events and fetes also raised significant income for Funds. The Mayors Fun Run in Carmarthen, the Ward 10 concert and Withybush Fete contributed over £5,500.

#### ii Legacy

During the year The Charity were the grateful recipients of numerous legacies providing substantial resources. The legacies included the following bequests:

- £6,533 bequeathed by Mrs OA Jones. These monies are to be divided between the Withybush Hospital General Fund, and the Gamma Camera Fund.
- £31,552 bequeathed by Mr RH Merrison to the Tenby Cottage Hospital.
- £40,000 bequeathed by Mrs CME Gibby to the Withybush Hospital Medical Equipment Fund
- £27,500 bequeathed by Mr TB Hughes to the Withybush Hospital General Fund.
- Other bequests totalling £7,788 were received.
- In addition to those monies included as part of previous year's financial records, a further amount of £2,936 was received from the estate of BM Downes. The total received to date in respect of this legacy stands at £96,611, specifically for services at South Pembrokeshire Hospital.



#### iii <u>Investment</u>

The Charity received income of £65,000 in the form of dividends and interest from investments and cash balances held by the trustees.

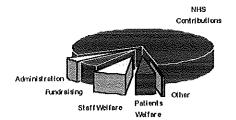
#### c. Expenditure

The Charity is primarily a grant making body, providing grants to the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust as a contribution to the cost of healthcare provision. NHS Contributions form 86% of the Charity's expenditure and many areas of service provision have benefited from the application of charitable funds during the financial year.

The purchase of equipment is a major area of NHS Contributions. This year the Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund has made possible the acquisition of various items of both medical and non-medical equipment.

Two pieces of capital equipment, an operating microscope and a Diode Laser, purchased by South Pembrokeshire Hospital, were funded by charitable contributions. Monitors were purchased from the Withybush General Hospital Trust Fund.

Analysis of Expenditure 1998-1999



Other purchases of medical equipment included a portable ventilator for the Accident and Emergency department, a Phototherapy Unit and Pulse Oximeter for the Special Care Baby Unit, a Finishing Machine for Podiatry and an Infusion Pump.

Non-medical equipment purchases included new furniture and fittings for Ystwyth Ward at St. David's Hospital, a pottery kiln for mental health occupational therapy services and mattresses for various locations. Significant funds have also been applied to the purchase of computers and computer equipment across both the Mental Health and Acute services of the Trust.

Funds are also applied to the upkeep, refurbishment and alteration of Trust premises. During 1998-1999 Charitable Funds contributed to the following minor schemes of work:

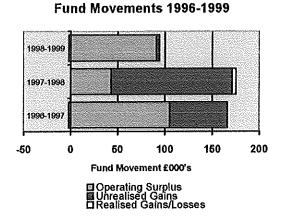
- Alterations to improve the environment and facilities of the Day Room on Ward 1
- Alterations to improve the male amenities on Ward 7
- Refurbishment of the Adolescent Unit with monies from the Ward 9 fund to provide a more comfortable client environment.
- Refurbishment of Ward 12 Day Room to promote a more comfortable client environment.
- Remodelling and refurbishment of staff facilities in the Pathology department to allow for improved use of department facilities.

#### d. Investments

Investments included in the accounts are at market values, rather than original cost, in accordance with accounting policy. The periodic revaluation of these investments gives rise to unrealised gains as included in the accounts.

#### e. Overall Financial Position

The balances of the charitable funds increased by £92,000 during the 1998-1999 financial year. This overall movement is attributed almost entirely to an income and expenditure surplus. The following graph illustrates the breakdown of fund movements for this and two previous financial years.

#### **FOREWORD**

These Accounts have been prepared by the authority under section 98(2) of the National Health Service Act 1977 (as amended) in the form in which the Secretary of State has, with the approval of the Treasury, directed.

During the 1998-99 financial year the umbrella registrations of the Pémbrokeshire NHS Trust Charitable Fund and the Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund were merged to form a single umbrella charity, Pembrokeshire and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Fund. Prior year figures have been restated to consolidate the accounts of the Pembrokeshire NHS Trust and Derwen NHS Trust Charitable Funds.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### 1. Accounting Policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the statement of recommended practice - Accounting for Charities - and with the Standard Accounting Practices and Policies for the NHS approved by the Secretary of State.

#### 1.2 Incoming resources

The policies followed, which deal with income, voluntary assistance and donations are:

#### a) Cash donations

Gifts, legacies, investment income and cash collected from fund raising events are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities as soon as the conditions for receipt have been met and there is a reasonable assurance of receipt.

#### b) Gifts in kind

- (i) Assets given for distribution by the charity are included in the Statement of Financial Activities only when distributed. For any undistributed assets at the year end, a description of the items involved and an estimate of their value is shown in a note in the accounts.
- (ii) Assets given for use by the charity (e.g. property for its own occupation) are included in the Statement of Financial Activities as incoming resources when receivable.
- (ii) Gifts made in kind but on trust for conversion into cash and subsequent application by the charity are included in the accounting period in which the gift is sold.

In all cases the amount at which gifts in kind are brought into account is either a reasonable estimate oftheir value to the charity or the amount actually realised. The basis of the valuation is disclosed in the annual report.

#### c) Intangible income

Intangible income is included in the accounts with an equivalent amount in outgoing resources.

#### 1.3 Tangible Fixed Assets

#### a) Capitalisation

All assets falling into the following categories are capitalised:

 tangible assets which are capable of being used for more than one year, and have a cost equal to or greater than £5,000;

#### 1. Accounting Policies (continued)

groups of tangible assets which are interdependent or would normally be provided or replaced as a group with a total value in excess of £5,000 and an individual value of £250 or more.

#### b) Valuation

#### Fixed assets are valued as follows:

- (i) Land, buildings, installations and fittings are stated at open market value for their existing use. Valuations are carried out professionally at five yearly intervals. The last valuation was made on the 1 April 1996. Between valuations an appropriate index is applied to revalue the assets;
- (ii) equipment is valued at the lower of estimated net replacement cost or recoverable amount;
- (iii) assets in the course of construction are valued at current cost.

#### c) Depreciation

- (i) Depreciation is charged on each main class of tangible asset as follows: land and assets in the course of construction are not depreciated. Buildings, installations and fittings are depreciated on their revalued amount over the assessed remaining life of the asset as advised by the professional valuers.
- (ii) Equipment is depreciated over the estimated life of the asset using the following standard lives

Fittings, other engineering plant & equipment	15 years
Vehicles	7 years
Furniture	10 years
Mainframe IT equipment	8 years
Office & IT equipment	5 years
Soft furnishings	7 years

#### d) Donated Assets

Donated assets are capitalised at their valuation on full replacement cost basis on receipt and are revalued and depreciated as described above.

#### 1.4 Investment Fixed Assets

Investment fixed assets are shown at market value.

(i) Property assets are not depreciated but are shown at market valuation. Valuation's are carried out by a professional valuer at five yearly intervals. The last such valuation was at 1 April 1996. Between valuations trustees' best estimate market value. Valuation gains and losses are recorded in the Statement of Financial Activities with unrealised gains for prior years separately identified. The balance sheet reflects the revalued amounts.

#### 1. Accounting Policies (continued)

- (ii) Quoted stocks and shares are included in the balance sheet at mid-market price, ex-div.
- (iii) Other investment fixed assets are included at trustees' best estimate market value.

#### 1.5 Intangible Fixed Assets

Intangible fixed assets are included at the trustees' best estimate of current value.

#### 1.6 Pensions Contributions

The cost of employer pensions contributions to the NHS Superannuation and other schemes is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities.

#### 1.7 Change in the Basis of Accounting

There has been no change in the basis of accounting during the year.
