



**Freedom of Information Request 669/20**

Under the FOI act I would like to request the following information.  
 Vehicles involved in “damage collision” or any traffic accidents including pedestrians since June 2016 to July 2020 north and South Bound along the A4054.  
 At entrance of Whitchurch Hospital /Park Crescent and along this road to the junction Pantmawr Road and Pendwyallt Road including junctions with Lon-y-Celyn –Hollybush Estate and Hollybush Pub.  
 At and from Junction Hollybush Estate along A4054 to Whitworth Square Junction with Pendwyallt Road, At and from Whitworth Square to the Junction of the Village Hotel on A4054.  
 At or from the Junction of the Village Hotel to the junction with Junction 32 Coryton roundabout.

We spoke to our analysts who have provided the below table which provides information to answer your request.
