## imary b Tollbar site

TOLLBAR Academy could open a new primary on its site in a surprise move which has sparked strong opposition among other schools.

other schools.

North East Lincolnshire Council is aiming to bid for eash from the Government to tackle a predicted shortfall in primary school places by 2016, caused by factors including major new housing development

school places by 2016, caused by factors including major new housing development plans.

Funding for a new primary school on land owned by Tollbar Academy, adjacent to Louth Road, is included in a raft of recommendations from the authority's Strategic Pupil Place Planning Group (SPPPG) which could form the bid.

If approved, the primary school would have an initial intake of 15 pupils and would be handed over to Tollbar Academy on completion in 2015.

However, concerns have been raised by the heads of the 11 primary schools which form the Villages Cluster, including those serving Humberston, New Waltham, Scartho, Waltham and East Ravendale.

In a letter responding to a consultation document sent out by the council outlining the plans, with respect to Tollbar they state: "Within the Villages Cluster, at least four schools are currently expecting to admit below PAN (published admission numbers) in September, Enfield and East

Ravendale significantly so.

"We see no logic in the authority introducing an additional primary school
provider into an area already well-served
by existing primary schools which have

provider into an area already well-served by existing primary schools which have spare places.

"This would have a detrimental impact on our schools, which would inevitably see a further decline in roll, as Tollbar would become the nearest primary provider for children currently in the catchment area for several of our schools."

Falling pupil numbers has major funding implications for schools. The letter also asks why, when an overview of proposals for this bid was shared with headteachers at a primary heads' meeting as recently as March 19, "there was no mention of the expansion of Tollbar into the primary sector."

It continues: "We would like to know what parties were involved in making this decision, as none of the headteachers of schools impacted were involved." It also asks: "Has there been any consultation with parents regarding this significant change in primary provision and the impact it will have on local schools."

It also says the heads request a meeting with the SPPPG "to discuss this matter further".

Sean Chesman, chair of governors at East Ravendale Church of England Primary School Academy, said he had 'no confidence in the council's ability to read the

future" and was worried about a lack of

transparency.
"Why haven't we all been engaged in this

transparency.

"Why haven't we all been engaged in this discussion "process properly?" he said, adding the funding bid was "putting the cart before the horse".

"It seems too far on for us to have just found out about it and now we are terribly, terribly concerned."

The council is bidding for a share of the Government's £982-million Targeted Basic Need programme for the expansion of good/outstanding schools and academies. The authority believes that in some areas of the borough there will be lower levels of surplus places than the recommended 10-per cent — in some cases nil which would have a negative impact on parental preference.

"If no action is taken in the identified areas of pressure it could result in some areas of the borough having insufficient school places available within reasonable walking distance for pupils," states the consultation document.

A new Tollbar primary would have access from what is currently a large lay-by owned by North East Lincolnshire Council, which previously formed part of the old Louth Road before Peaks Parkway opened.

David Hampson, chief executive of Tollbar Family of Academies, said: "We are aware that in a couple of years there will be a shortage of primary places in the region. The council's proposal would seek to

address this issue.

"This would mean that Tollbar Academy would become the first 3-19 education provider in this area and, as an advocate of all-through education, I am delighted to support this.

"We are happy that this proposal would not put any extra pressure on the local traffic situation and would, in fact, provide a very safe and convenient entrance and exit for the primary school on land that is already owned by the local authority. "The area of land alongside Louth Road at the end of our main school also lends itself perfectly to a primary school, as it is too wet for sports and currently has no other use." He added: "We already have members of

He added: "We already have members of staff in place who have many years of experience in primary education and, of course, we are hoping to be joined by Reynolds Primary School, which has applied to join our Multi-Academy Trust later this year.
"As a Family of Academies we will work together to provide the best possible educational outcomes for all of our students." Cllr Ian Lindley, portfolio holder for people services, said: "The rise in demand for school places is a nationwide issue. The Government has released two funding streams from which local authorities can bid for an allocation.

## **Bold Alex blunts** Sheffield's steel

CLEETHORPES 1st XI got their 2013 Yorkshire League campaign off to a good start with a comprehensive 77-run home win against Sheffield United

run home win against Sheffield United on Saturday.
The match was a personal triumph for new skipper Alex Osmond who followed up a memorable century with a crucial five-wicket haul. Batting first Cleethorpes racked up a mammoth 257-4 in their 55 overs.
Openers Bill Kirby (28) and David Mansfield (12) got the home side off to a steady start while the innings was given impetus from Yaniv Judah who followed up his fine pre-season form with a fine 80 runs in 113 balls including seven fours and a towering six.

followed up his fine pre-season form with a fine 80 runs in 1.13 halls including seven fours and a towering six. It was only in the final eight overs of the innings that Cleethorpes pulled away with Osmond, in particular, in brutal mood. He and Judah added a further 87 runs to take their fourth wicket stand to 143 with Osmond racing to a brilliant 70-ball hundred which included five sixes and 10 fours. After reaching 50 in 47 balls he took only another 23 to reach three figures.

With a ponderous start from Sheffield, Cleethorpes were in little danger of losing the game with returning South Aftican professional Graham Hume and Fred Lumby striking early blows. Osmond then ran through the middle order with only a 78-run sixth wicket stand holding Cleethorpes up. Once Osmond broke through again the only question remaining was if Cleethorpes could clinch maximum points. However, Sheffield's last wicket

pair held firm to close on 180-9 as Osmond finished with fine figures of 5/44 in 17 overs with Hume 2/47 in his 17

Cleethorpes 2nds suffered an early wake up call with a massive 199-run hammering by a highly fancied Alford on Saturday. The home side made a massive 300-5 in their 50 overs as the massive 300-o in men oo over at Cleethorpes weakened bowling attack

Callum Robinson proved Cleethorpes' most successful bowler with 2/61 in just seven overs. while Stuart Harvey, Ryan Harrison and Ian Hallam also added wickets. Rob Baty (19) and Harrison (18) gave Meggies early hope before a middle order collapse saw them quickly fall away with only John Mansfield (16) showing any real conviction as they were bowled out for just

101 in the 28th over.
Cleethorpes 3rds began life in the Second Division but went down to a five wicket defeat to newly promoted Hibaldstow after posting a competitive 182-8 in their 45 overs. Despite most

batsmen getting a start only skipper Paul Hewstone's bright 39 not out took Cleethorpes to a fourth batting point. Mike Chamberlain made 35 while there were good cameos from 13-year old Jordan Cook (21) and Liam Dickens (20). James Keast (10) added a valuable 39 for the eighth wicket with Hew

able 39 for the eighth wicket with Hewstone.

A shoddy fielding display saw some seven catches dropped as Hibaldstow timed their reply perfectly to run out winners in the 44th over. Simon Taylor and Dickens opened with the new ball and repeatedly beat the bat while Keast showed early promise with the ball. Cook got Cleethorpes back in the game with two late wickets but it was too little too late in a poor opener.

Cleethorpes 4ths began life in the Fourth Division with a 29-run defeat at Holton-le-Clay. Chasing a challenging 206-9 they closed on 177-9 with Callum Carter (63) hitting an excellent first half century for Cleethorpes. Lewis Markham hit 27 with Dan Healey (19 not out) before the innings ran out of stream. Cleethorpes attack had earlier fought back well, with off spinner Ed Lumby picking up 5/38 in nine overs with Healy 2/10 in five overs with Kris Hall and Markham adding wickets.
