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## THE CITY OF CHESTER (HAMILTON PLACE AREA) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING)ORDER 1999

The Council of the City of Chester (hereinafter referred to as 'the Council') pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Cheshire and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act') and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 6 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 3. Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicles to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in the Article as the case may be, for as long as may be necessary:-
  - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) to enable the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
  - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, the side of road or the length of road so referred to or in the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said side of road or the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
  - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
  - (e) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said road, the said side of road or the said length of road.
- 4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in the Article as

the case may be for as long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle.

- 5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to permit or cause any disabled person's vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period of not more than three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day) providing there is displayed on the vehicle in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver has marked the time at which the period of waiting began).
- 6. The restrictions imposed by Articles 1 and 2 of this Order shall not apply to the following vehicles, that is to say:-

Hackney carriages whilst waiting at a duly authorised cab rank.

Pedal cycles whilst parked in a duly authorised cycle parking facility, the location of which has been approved by the Highway Authority and the Chief Officer of Police.

- 7. The Orders specified in Schedule 3 to this Order are hereby revoked to the extent specified in the said Schedule.
- 8. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 9. The Order shall come into operation on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1999 and may be cited as "The City of Chester" (Hamilton Place Area) (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading) Order 1999.
