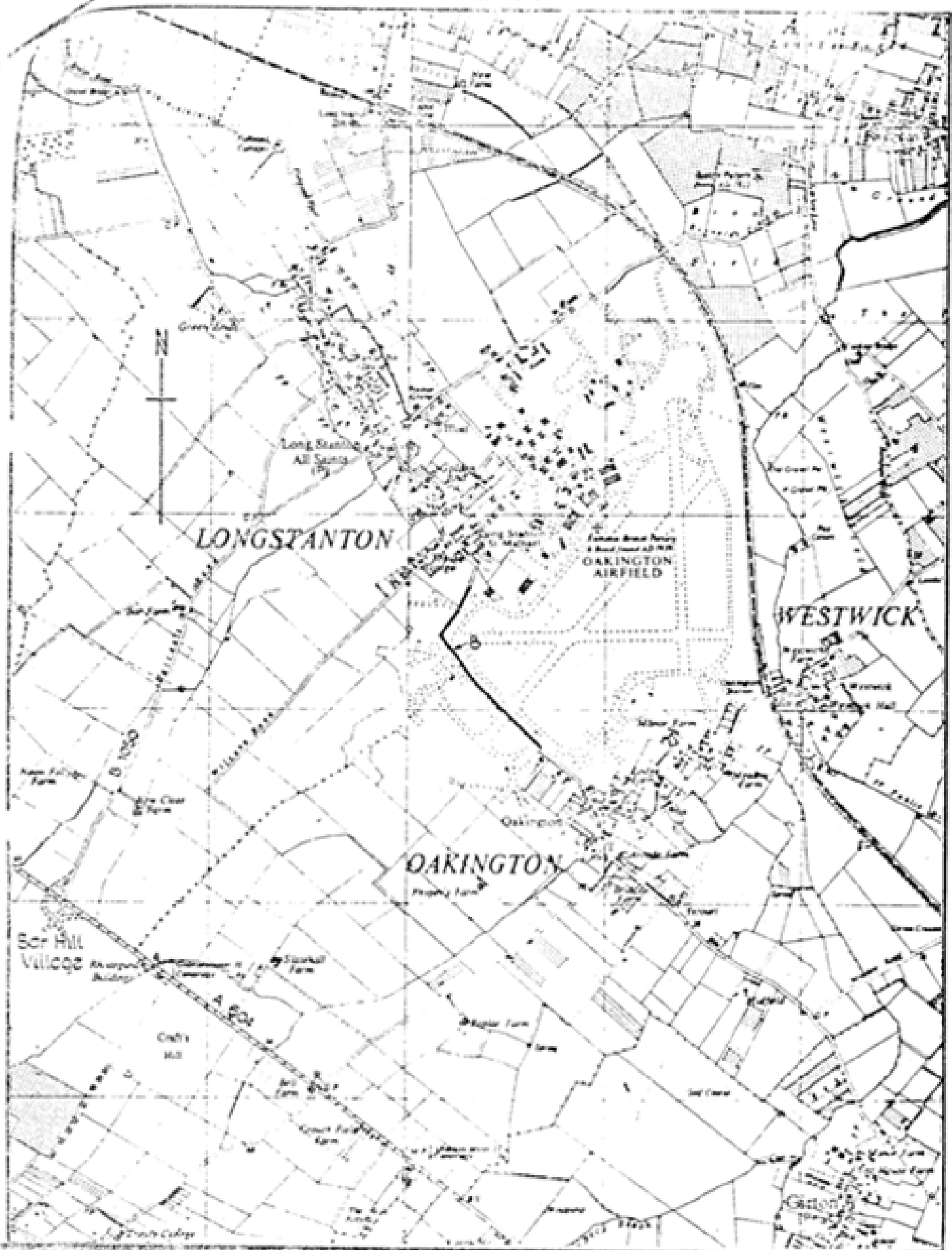

TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER



THE COUNTY OF CAMBRIDGESHIRE

(OAKINGTON - LONGSTANTON ROAD)

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 1979

The Cambridgeshire County Council in exercise of their powers under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other powers then enabling in that behalf, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 5th day of March 1979 and may be cited as "The County of Cambridgeshire (Oakington - Longstanton Road) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1979."
2. In this Order -
 - "hackney carriage" has the same meaning as in section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;
 - "public service vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 117 of the Road Traffic Act 1960;
 - "invalid carriage" has the same meaning as in section 29 of the Act of 1967;
 - "moped" means a motor cycle whereof the cylinder capacity of the engine does not exceed fifty cubic centimetres, being a cycle equipped with pedals whereof it is capable of being propelled.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed at any time on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed on the length of road specified in that Article if the motor vehicle is -
 - (a) a public service vehicle;
 - (b) a moped;
 - (c) an invalid carriage;
 - (d) a hackney carriage;
 - (e) being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;

- (f) being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the length of road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon that land; or
- (g) being used for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any land situated on or adjacent to the length of road.

5. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1967 or by or under any other enactment.
