"this case concerns the application of the EIA Directive and the implementation of Directive 87/217 on the control of atmospheric pollution by asbestos. It concerns a demolition site in Widnes for which planning permission was apparently given by the Local Authority, Given that this is a pilot case, it will be for one of the central government departments to respond on behalf of the UK. Given that the overall thrust of the complaint is the fear of asbestos dust in the air, I think this does fall to Defra to coordinate the response and almost certainly to somebody in ALE. I am therefore copying in will need to find a policy home in ALE. Whether that will be or someone else l am afraid I do not know. Having said that, I think it will be necessary for the person coordinating the response to obtain the input of the following to inform the response: The local authority in relation to planning permission, the conditions which were attached, who is supervising compliance with those conditions and any EIA screening exercise which was carried out HSE on the regulations which implement arts 7 and 8 of Directive 87/217. In particular, whether this demolition project is notifiable to them under the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2007 and whether a plan for the demolition was drawn up and whether they are supervising compliance with that plan. The owner of the site on the steps they have taken to control asbestos dust. Following that, it may be necessary to get comments from DCLG on the EIA screening process and possibly from other defra colleagues on the treatment and disposal of waste from this site. I am afraid I have not been able to find the regulations which implement art 7 of Directive 87/217 in the time I have spent so far. I do not think this is something which falls under the Control of Asbestos Regulations 2006 (these relate to working conditions) nor is it something which is regulated under the Environmental Permitting regulations. I think HSE will know the implementing regulations and my guess is that they are responsible for enforcing them. We need to coordinate a response by early January so work needs to start fairly quickly on obtaining the input I have suggested above." you have already said that your colleagues would be able to assist on the EIA screening process. Stuart - would your colleagues be able to assist on second point? Also, grateful if you could confirm suggestion that HSE are responsible for enforcing the implementing regulations. As soon as I have received confirmation from the Divisional Manager on the lead official for this case, I will ask them Apologies to all for the delay in allocating this case correctly. Many thanks.
